# Graddau Degrees

## Enillwch BA neu FdA drwy astudio'n rhan-amser!

Mae myfyriwr ar y radd ran amser yn gwneud yr un faint o waith â myfyriwr llawn amser, ond dros gyfnod hwy o amser. Byddwch fel arfer yn dilyn 3 modiwl bob semester, ond mae'n bosibl gwneud ychydig mwy neu ychydig llai o fodiwlau ar y tro. Mae'r rhan fwyaf o fyfyrwyr yn cwblhau gradd mewn 5 mlynedd.

Nid oes raid i chi gael unrhyw gymwysterau arbennig. Mae profiad proffesiynol a sgiliau a ddatblygwyd yn y gwaith a gartref yn cael eu hystyried wrth benderfynu a fyddwn yn cynnig lle i chi. Fel rheol byddem yn disgwyl cynnig lle i unrhyw un y teimlwn y byddai'n elwa o astudio Gradd.

## Gain a BA or FdA through part-time study!

Part-time degrees have a modular structure, which means that you can work at your own pace. Modules are usually 10 or 20 credits in length, and are generally studied over one semester. Most students can expect to complete a Degree in 5 years.

You do not need any particular qualifications. Professional experience and skills developed at work or in the home will be taken into account when deciding whether to offer you a place. In general we would expect to offer a place to anyone whom we feel would benefit from studying a Degree.

Foundation degrees are designed in collaboration with employers working within the relevant sector and result in a more practical and applied degree. We currently offer four Foundation Degrees:

### FdA in Substance Misuse NEW

This exciting and innovative programme has been established to respond to individuals and organisations who are involved either directly or indirectly with the Drugs and Alcohol misuse sector.

The programme will be of value to anyone currently working in the Substance Misuse field who may have practical experience but for whom the theoretical framework would allow them to enhance their knowledge and up-skill their practice. This programme would also be suitable for those who have an interest in developing their career in this area or simply want to undertake some of the individual modules that are of particular interest.

The programme is mapped to the underpinning knowledge of the relevant Drug and Alcohol National Occupational Standards (DANOS).

### FdA Management of Care

This part-time degree is designed for those operating at management level, or aspiring to do so in the near future within the Social Care sector. It is particularly relevant to holders of, and those working towards, the NVQ Registered Managers Award. The degree is supported by CARE FORUM WALES, the association for the independent care sector and is on the Care Council for Wales Vocationally Related Qualifications Framework. The course is offered in partnership with Coleg Llysfasi and Coleg Menai (Llangedfni campus).

In this unique, innovative and updated course you will have the opportunity to explore and address the myriad experiences and issues of women's life and work.

In the first year you will focus on 2 core modules...

- Gender Equality and Diversity
- Theory into Action

These will give you a solid grounding in ideas and areas of study possible. The teaching sessions take place on Tuesday evenings between 18.30 - 21.00 in Dean St, Bangor. We also hold regular Saturday study days in Bangor and at the end of the first year a short residential study period will be organised, usually at Gregynog, the University of Wales' study centre.

In the second year you will study the core research module and have the opportunity to select options from a list that currently includes:

- Women, crime and deviance
- Women and literature
- Welsh women's history
- Women, film and popular culture
- Gender and education
- Women, work and community

In addition the following modules are being validated or updated for 2009 delivery.

- Women, Enterprise and Management
- Women and Development
- Women, Politics and Social Action
- Women, War and Conflict

In the third year you undertake your dissertation research and writing and you will each be allocated a dissertation tutor to support your work. Past students' work has been published in the Women's Studies Monograph Series.

An annual International Women's Day Conference is held and the March 2009 theme is 'Women Learning'. This day counts as one of your Saturday study days and you will be encouraged to run a workshop or do a poster presentation for this event.

We are exploring the possibilities of study exchanges with other women's learning projects around the world, with opportunities to exchange with Pakistan, Nicaragua, Cuba, Ireland, Finland and Romania amongst the options. A virtual network between these projects is entirely probable but physical exchange depends strongly on funding, which is being sought presently.

## Debbie Holmes Rhyl

"Gadewais yr ysgol yn 16 gydag ychydig o gymwysterau ac es i'r coleg i wneud cwrs cyn-nyrsio a chefais waith fel cynorthwy-ydd ffisiotherapydd. Yn 1985 gadewais y gwaith i fod yn wraig ty a mam am 10 mlynedd, ac yn ystod yr amser yma, dechreuais wneud gwaith gwirfoddol. Erbyn 1995, roeddwn yn gadeirydd cymdeithas y trigolion lleol, heb fawr o hyder, ond yn benderfynol o wella bywydau pobl ar yr ystâd lle rwy'n byw. Cefais fy annog i gael cymhwyster mewn Datblygu Cymunedol, er mwyn rhoi theori i'r holl waith roeddwn i wedi bod yn ei wneud. Yn 2005 cefais swydd yng Nghanolfan Gydweithredol Cymru fel brocer cymunedol ar gyfer y project Cymunedau@ ei Gilydd. Mae'r modiwlau Datblygu Cymunedol Ôl-radd yn fy helpu i gael gwell dealltwriaeth o sut mae cymunedau'n gweithio. Mae'r holl fodiwlau'n ymwneud â'm gwaith i ar hyn o bryd, ac maent wedi gwella fy ngwybodaeth a'm sgiliau gan ei gwneud yn bosibl eu trosglwyddo i unrhyw swyddi yn y dyfodol. Fe wnaeth y theori ar y cwrs fy helpu i ddeall cymhlethodau cymunedau a chymdeithas a sut gellir goresgyn problemau drwy ddefnyddio cyfryngau syml a chael dealltwriaeth o sut mae ffactorau economaidd, cymdeithasol ac amgylcheddol yn effeithio ar gymunedau."

"I left school at 16 with few qualifications and went to college to do a pre nursing course and found employment as a physiotherapist's aide. In 1985 I took time out to be a housewife and mother for 10 years and during that time I became involved in voluntary work. By 1995 I was chair of the local residents association, lacking confidence but determined to improve the lives of people on the estate where I live. I was encouraged to get a qualification in Community Development; this was to apply the theory to all the work I had been doing. In 2005 I got a job at the Wales Co-operative Centre as a community broker for the Communities@One project. The Postgrad Community Development modules are helping me achieve a greater understanding of how communities work. All the modules tie in nicely into my current working role and have enhanced my knowledge and skills making them transferable to any future roles. The theory on the course helped me to understand the complexities of communities and society and how solutions to issues can be overcome by using simple tools and having an understanding of how economic, social and environmental factors impact on communities."

## MA/MEd Education Programme

The well established part-time MA/MEd Programme gives students the opportunity to study modules in an extensive range of subject areas that are taught on five weekends over the academic year.

An 'Open Menu' of modules is offered in the MA/MEd Programme and most of the modules can be studied either as an individual unit or in combination to form part of a Certificate, Diploma or full Master's Degree of study. Applicants are free to choose to do one, two or (exceptionally) three modules in a year, steadily building credit towards their intended award. Several identifiable 'pathways' are built-in to the programme in areas such as Dyslexia, Special Needs, Global Education and Counselling. However, all combinations of modules are allowed.

## Writing: Practice and Context

- MA
- Diploma
- Postgraduate Certificate

This innovative part-time programme is designed for those who want to develop new directions as writers, whether in creative or professional contexts. Taught by published authors, it explores the links between different areas of writing through practice-based seminars and workshops. It also considers wider questions such as how creativity relates to writing, and how language shapes, and is shaped by, the culture in which it is produced.

The course can be taken as a Postgraduate Certificate (1 year - 2 modules), Diploma (2 years - 4 modules) or MA. Four taught modules, followed by an extended creative writing project completed under supervision, lead to an MA. Modules run on Tuesday evenings 18.00 - 20.30 in Semesters 1 and 2.

Modules offered in 2008-09 will be Life Writing, Self and Identity and Writing in Context. These two modules can be taken individually, or together as a Postgraduate Certificate course, or as the first stage of an MA.

Autumn 2008, starting Tuesday 30.09.08:

### Life Writing, Self and Identity (30 credits)

This module presents life writing as a source for a sustained writing practice, a growing area in publishing, and a critical field in which ideas of the self and subjectivity can be explored. Writing from personal experience will be encouraged both as an end in itself and as a starting point for working in other genres. Comparison between genres will be linked to discussion of publication opportunities, to ethics in writing practice, to questions of authorship and representation, and to the relationship between fact and fiction.

January 2009

### Writing in Context (30 credits)

As a means of developing students' capacity to reflect on and develop their work, this advanced creative writing course will focus on the relationship of students' own writing to contemporary cultural contexts, whether local or global. Creative work in poetry and fiction will be at the core of the module, but it will be strengthened by critical reading that will enable participants to situate the personal creative process within broader perspectives within Wales and beyond.

Modules running in 2009-2010 will include **Creative Writing, Creative Thinking and Applications of Writing.**

The Community Development Unit can develop and deliver specific learning opportunities to answer your community's needs. Delivery will be to YOUR community group/s, YOU will help develop the content you require, learning when it is convenient to YOU!

The learning is accredited so you can gain a qualification as you answer your community's needs and your community activities form the basis of the assessed work. The learning units are packaged as 10, 20 or 30 credit units and you can study as many or as few as you like. Once you have passed 120 credits you will earn a Higher Education Certificate in Community Development, 240 credits gets you a Foundation degree in Community Development.

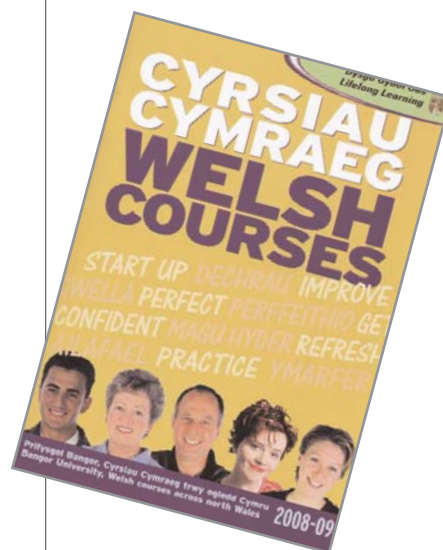

# How Our Qualifications Work

## Higher Education Certificates

A module can be studied on its own, or you may decide to continue your studies and move on to complete a Higher Education Certificate. It is possible to choose your own programme of studies to achieve a Certificate in Open Studies or you may prefer to study towards a named Certificate, for example a Certificate in Local History, Certificate in Fine Art, Certificate in Personal, Professional Skills and a Certificate in Community Development.

Certificates are made up of 120 credits at Level 1, which is equivalent to the first year of a full time University degree. Named Certificates are made up of core and optional modules.

No prior qualifications are needed to register for a Certificate apart from the Certificate in Fine Art for which there are certain pre-requisites.

All part-time students are allowed to register for a maximum of 90 credits in one academic year and can gain a certificate in three semesters (about 18 months). You can, however, build up your credits gradually and take up to five years to achieve a named Certificate. It may be worth bearing in mind that there are a number of new means-tested schemes for part-time students who are considering studying for at least 60 credits in one academic year. (See section on Course fees).

## Higher Education Diplomas & Degrees

Once you've completed a HE Certificate you may decide to continue your studies at a higher level. Diploma courses are at Level 2 (equiv. to second year full time degree) and students will normally have successfully completed a certificate before embarking on the Diploma. As with the named Certificates, the Diploma and Degrees have a set structure, with core modules that you must complete and optional modules which you can choose from. After completing the diploma level, students can move on to degree level - Level 3. Diplomas and Degrees can be obtained in the following subject areas:

- Foundation Degree Management of Care
- Foundation Degree in Early Childhood & Learning Support Studies
- Foundation Degree in Community Development
- Foundation Degree in Substance Misuse
- Diploma and Degree in Social Studies
- Diploma and Degree in Literature with Creative Writing
- Diploma and Degree in Combined Studies
- Diploma and Degree in Fine Art

## Credit Transfer

Please note: if you gain a named Certificate, this can be counted as having achieved Level 1 in the Combined Studies degree. This means that you may start this programme at Level 2. If you wish to enter another degree programme, such as the Foundation Degree in Management of Care, or BA Degrees in Social Studies or Literature with Creative Writing or Community Development, you will be able to transfer some credits towards these, though the precise number will depend on the modules you have studied and will be subject to the approval of the Programme Board of Studies.

# Fees and Funding for 2008-09

**Category 1** - Full Fee payable £105 per 10 credit module.

**Category 2** - Half Fee if you do not qualify for full fee waiver benefits and are: unwaged **OR** in receipt of a state pension **OR** live in a low affluence area\* **OR** a BU Welsh Language learner following Welsh medium modules. (Not available for postgraduate courses.)

**Category 3** - Full Fee Waiver (no fees). You may qualify for a full fee waiver in accordance with one of the following schemes:

**a) HEFCW Fee Waiver Scheme:** if you are on benefits such as Job Seekers allowance, Income Support, Housing Benefit, Council Tax Benefit and Working Tax Benefit and do not already have a degree.

**b) Lifelong Learning Fee Waiver Scheme:** if you are resident in Communities First area\*. (Not available for postgraduate courses.)

**c) Taster Modules:** if you have no previous experience of higher education, then you could study on a short, part-time (10-20 credit - level 1) course marked with a # in this brochure. This particular offer is non-means tested.

By ticking category 2 or relevant category 3 box on your enrolment form, we will contact you for further information to conform with the above categories.

**An administration charge of £10 will be charged for those given a full fee waiver or enrolling on a taster module.**

In addition to the above, there are also a number of other Government grants and means-tested schemes that could help you meet the cost of your course. Guidance only is given here and you are advised to check with your Local Education Authority as there are different schemes for new and continuing students:

- If you do not have a first degree we advise current or potential students to check if they are eligible for a Part-time Higher Education grant.
- Part-time higher education course expenses grant (up to £1000) may also be available to help with books, travel and course materials.

These two part time grants normally apply to students who are intending to complete a Higher Education Certificate, Diploma or Honours degree and are committed to studying a minimum of 60 and a maximum of 90 credits in one academic year (Sept-July).

You can also visit the Student Finance Wales website [www.studentfinancewales.co.uk](http://www.studentfinancewales.co.uk) and follow the information for part-time students.

Other schemes include:

- Disabled Student Allowance
- Assembly Learning Grant
- Individual Learning Account (Welsh for Adults courses only)
- Lifelong Learning Discretionary Bursary - limited funds are available to help students whose circumstances do not fit any of the above and normally when all known avenues of funding are closed. They are not normally available to those undertaking post-graduate courses, but post-graduates can apply. These bursaries will normally be made available for those in the following categories: Household income below £19,000 per year (gross) - normally full fee waiver Household income between £19,000 and £32,000 (gross) per year - normally half fee waiver. These bursaries are being offered on a one year only basis and are discretionary. Contact 01248 382256 for further details.
