National dress refers to traditional costumes of an ethnic group.



Due to different living environment and cultural differences, Chinese costumes developed many various styles in different ethnic minorities. Han constitutes the main group of Chinese.

Its traditional national costume is hanfu.

Cheongsam is one of the traditional costume for female, derived from Manchu women's traditional clothing, improved by women of Han in the first half of the twentieth century. It is identified as one of the national dress by the government of the Republic of China in 1929. After the Republic of China, women in Shanghai and Beijing improved the clothing. There are 56 minority groups in China.
