Management Review and Environment Report Procedure

Purpose:

This procedure details the format and requirements of the Management Review meeting and guidance for the creation of the Annual Environment Report.

1. Annual Management Review

In accordance with Clause 9.3 of the ISO14001:2015 standard, a Management Review of the EMS will be undertaken by the Sustainability Strategy Group (SSG) annually.

The purpose of the Management Review is to review the Environmental Management System (EMS) and ensure it remains suitable, adequate, and effective.

Responsibilities:

The Campus Environmental Performance Team (CEPT) are responsible for compiling and presenting information relevant to the University's overall environmental performance, functioning of the EMS and findings of the Annual Environment Report.

2. Annual Environment Report

The Annual Environment Report provides a summary of the University's environmental performance against the Objectives and Targets set out in the EMS.

Each Annual Environment Report will cover a period of one academic year, 1st August – 31st July, unless otherwise required and explained in the report.

Responsibilities: CEPT officers are responsible for collecting the necessary data from the relevant staff and compiling the Report. After approval, the Annual Environment Report will be made publicly
available via the University website.
