Ordinance 13 The Court

1. Constitution of the Court

The following shall be members of the Court:

- a. Ex-officio members:
 - i. The Chancellor
 - ii. The Pro-Chancellor
 - iii. The Vice-Chancellor;
 - iv. The Deputy Vice-Chancellor(s) and Pro Vice-Chancellor(s);
 - v. Deans of College
 - vi. Members of the Council
 - vii. Assembly Members and Members of Parliament for such constituencies as covered by the Councils listed in 1.e.i. below.
- b. Representatives from the Education sector
 - i. The Principals of the Further Education institutions in North Wales, appointed by the institutions.
- c. Representatives from the Health sector
 - i. One representative from the Betsi Cadwaladr University Health Board, and one representative from any other Health Boards in Wales as may be specified by the Council on an annual basis.
- d. Representatives of Civic Dignitaries, and senior public figures
 - i. One representative from the City of Bangor Council
 - ii. Her Majesty's Lord Lieutenant for the County of Gwynedd
- e. Representatives appointed by Public Authorities
 - i. One representative from each of the principle Councils of Anglesey, Conwy, Denbighshire, Flintshire, Gwynedd, Powys and Wrexham appointed by the Councils.
- f. Representatives of Trade Unions and Professional Groups
 - i. A member of University staff appointed by each of the recognised campus trades unions, appointed by the unions.
- g. Representatives from industry, business and commerce
 - i. One representative nominated by the North Wales Business Club.
 - ii. One representative nominated by the CBI (North Wales).

- h. Student representatives
 - i. Two persons nominated by the Students' Union
- i. Alumni representatives
 - i. Two persons nominated by the Alumni Advisory Board
- j. Co-opted members
 - i. Up to 10 lay persons appointed by the council.
- 2. The Court is a public meeting, but only members may vote on any matter.
- 3. Terms of Membership of the Court
 - a. Members shall normally hold office for three years, from the date of their appointment.
 - b. Representative members shall vacate office on ceasing to be members of the body appointing them, except in cases where they were not such member when the appointment was made.
 - c. Ex-officio members shall be members of the Court for the duration of their relevant periods of office.
 - d. Members coming to the end of their terms may be considered for re-appointment or re-election for one further term.
 - e. A member of the Court may resign at any time by writing to the Secretary to the Court.
 - f. The person or body which appointed any member of Court, whose place has become vacant shall take steps to fill the vacancy as soon as conveniently possible.
- 4. Powers of the Court
 - a. To receive, comment and ask questions on reports on the workings of the University;
 - b. To receive, comment and ask questions on the Annual Audited Financial Statements;
 - c. To discuss any matters relating to the University and to make recommendations to the Council as it sees fit;
 - d. To act as a forum to discuss the University's role in the community.
- 5. Meetings of the Court
 - a. The Court shall meet at least annually to receive information on the working of the University.
 - b. The Annual Meeting of the Court shall include:
 - 1. Welcome by the Chancellor;
 - 2. A report on the work of the University by the Chair of Council;
 - 3. The annual Accounts;
 - 4. An address by the Vice-Chancellor; and
 - 5. Other presentations on University activity.

- c. The programme for the Court meeting shall be distributed in both Welsh and English
- d. All members shall have the right, when addressing the Court, to speak in either Welsh or English.
