The Students' Union

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The Students' Union

1. The organisation of students of Bangor University shall be known as the Students' Union, as defined in the Charter, paragraph 17. The Students' Union seeks to enhance the student experience by providing representation, welfare services, recreational facilities and opportunities for student development within the Students' Union, the University and the local community.
2. All registered students of the University shall be eligible to become ordinary members of the Students' Union.
3. The relationship between Bangor University and the Students' Union is set out in the Council approved Constitution between the two parties. The purpose of the Constitution is to set out clearly the nature of the relationship between the University and the Students' Union, and the obligations and responsibilities which arise. Subject to the provisions of such Constitution, the Students' Union shall have the power to manage its own affairs and funds. No amendment to or recission of the Constitution shall be valid unless approved by Council.
4. The Constitution is reviewed annually by the Students' Union Board of Trustees and the University Executive Board.
5. Members of Council from the Students' Union shall comprise of the President of the Students' Union and one other elected officer of the Students' Union appointed by the executive of that organisation and, in accordance with paragraph 11 of the Charter, for a term for so long as they continue to occupy their respective position unless removed in accordance with the Ordinances. Normally, the other elected officer will be the President of Undeb Myfyrwyr Cymraeg Bangor (UMCB).
6. Members of Senate from the Students' Union shall comprise three representatives to be appointed by the Students' Union and in accordance with Ordinance 12.
