NHS 3157 Health Leadership 20 Credits

Are you new to a leadership or management role, or looking to move into such a role soon? Maybe you have been in a role for a while? This module will complement any professional or non-clinical learning you may be undertaking, or this can be taken as a standalone module.

The course is structured around leadership and the (1) Self (you); (2) team; and (3) organisation. You will understand the current and context, theory and research into leadership, along with an understanding of leadership approaches. Alongside this, and of importance, you will start to develop your own voice as a leader, through the development of your own self-awareness and confidence.

In short , you will understand the context in which you are becoming (or are already) a leader, and understand how you can develop further. you develop as a leader.
