ABOUT THE STUDY

Models for service improvement in health care tend to reflect traditional approaches to evidence-based practice where evidence is published, and implementation is monitored. The limitations of this approach are now widely acknowledged, where implementation is influenced by the people involved, the organisational context in which evidence is implemented, and the process by which implementation itself is organised. It is essential therefore that evidence implementation is undertaken within an organisational learning context where workforce and service development are fully integrated.
