Aims of the module

This exciting interactive programme creates an accredited opportunity for Nurses to develop the knowledge and skills to return back to a career in healthcare. Our ambition is to draw on your prior experience, and your commitment to excellence in patient care, to prepare you for a return to the dynamic world of nursing. The undertaking of an approved Return to Practice Course is mandatory for practitioners who do not meet the NMC revalidation standards and wish to renew their registration. Working in partnership with [Betsi Cadwaladr University Health Board \(BCUHB\)](#), learning will be focused on updating your knowledge of contemporary nursing, underpinned by the principles of safe, effective, and person-centred care. The course is open to adult, mental health, child and learning disability nurses.

What does the course consist of?

This is a 30 credit, degree level 6 module. This module aims to enable the student to reapply to the NMC register with the ability to function safely and effectively as an accountable professional through updating of knowledge and skills.

Career Prospects

Completion of this course enhances prospects for employment nationally and internationally within the health and health promotion sectors. The course has an excellent record for assisting successful students to return to employment.

MODULE OUTCOMES

- Critically discuss the influence of health and social policy relevant to the practice of nursing
- Clinical knowledge and skills will be consolidated during a 12 week part-time practice placement within BCUHB, designed to meet to field specific needs of the programme.
- Utilise relevant literature and research to inform the practice of nursing
- Demonstrate and reflect on own ability to identify and assess need, design and implement interventions, and evaluate outcomes in all relevant areas of practice, including the effective delivery of appropriate emergency care
