

EMERGENCY ARRANGEMENTS On hearing a fire alarm



Stop work immediately

If safe, turn off equipment, close doors

Leave by the nearest, safest exit and go to the Assembly Point

Report missing colleagues or disabled persons who have remained at a Refuge Point

Only return to the building when instructed by Security or the Emergency Services



EMERGENCY ARRANGEMENTS On hearing a fire alarm



Use lifts

Take personal belongings, carry hot drinks etc

Re-enter buildings until instructed by Security or Emergency Services

Stand too close to the building or obstruct emergency routes

Leave the Assembly Point e.g. sit in your car or go for a coffee elsewhere

EMERGENCY ARRANGEMENTS If you cannot evacuate via stairs

Refuge Points are designed to hold occupants during a fire alarm or other emergency.

Refuge Points have communication systems which link to Security. This allows the occupant to wait for further advice knowing their location is known. Also use them, if for example, the lift is broken and you are stuck on a floor.





Refuge Points have this symbol

A range of other information to support staff is also given. This includes guidance for staff with a visitor needing assistance in an evacuation.

EMERGENCY ARRANGEMENTS Common fire signs



Fire Exit Signs: Direct on how to quickly leave a building



Mandatory Signs: Means you must do what it says



Refuge Point: Includes operation details



Assembly Point: Where to wait safely on evacuating a building



Fire Action Notices: Displayed in all Buildings. They provide general fire safety information
