

## INFORMATION SHEET: ETHICAL APPROVAL PROCESS FOR THE USE OF X-RAYS FOR MEDICAL AND RESEARCH PURPOSES

This Information Sheets provides guidance to University staff and students on meeting the ethical approval requirements stipulated by the Ionising Radiation (Medical Exposure) Regulations 2000 when x-raying patients and volunteers for medical or research purposes.

## **Introduction**

Bangor University operates DEXA X-ray machines which can provide valuable scientific and medical information about human anatomy. Patients and volunteers will be exposed to low levels of ionising radiation during scans and as such the requirements of the Ionising Radiation (Medical Exposure) Regulations (IRMER) 2000 apply.

A key requirement of the IRMER Regulations is that all exposure to ionising radiation for medical and research purposes must be subject to rigorous ethical considerations to ensure no unnecessary exposure takes place. The table below outlines the specific ethics approval requirements for the different types of DEXA X-ray use.
