

Efrydiaeth PhD a gyllidir

Mae Ysgol Iaith, Diwylliant a'r Celfyddydau, Prifysgol Bangor yn gwahodd ceisiadau am Efrydiaeth PhD yn dechrau 1 Ionawr 2022.

Disgwylir i'r ymgeisydd llwyddiannus wneud PhD llawn-amser ar elfen o ddiwylliant, llenyddiaeth a chymdeithas yr Eidal (yr 20fed ganrif a chyfoes yn ddelfrydol), a chaiff gyfle i gymryd rhan yng nghynllun Addysgu mewn Addysg Uwch Prifysgol Bangor; caiff y ffioedd eu hepgor drwy gydol cyfnod cyflawni'r PhD. Tâl: £14,000 y flwyddyn Mae'r efrydiaeth ar gael tan 31 Rhagfyr 2024 (gydag opsiwn i ymestyn am flwyddyn arall).

Un o amodau'r efrydiaeth hon fydd bod yr ymgeisydd llwyddiannus yn darparu cymorth gyda dyletswyddau addysgu yn adran Eidaleg yr Adran Ieithoedd Modern a Diwyllianau. Bydd hyn yn bennaf yn cynnwys darparu dysgu iaith, datblygu adnoddau addysgu, a marcio aseiniadau ac ni fydd yn fwy na 16 awr yr wythnos.

Dylai bod gan ymgeiswyr fan leiaf radd gyntaf dda (BA neu gymhwyster cyfwerth), a bod â lefel rhuglder rhagorol mewn Eidaleg, yn ogystal ag uchelgais i wneud ymchwil i lefel doethuriaeth. (*Rhagor o fanylion isod -gweler 'Manyleb'*)

Mae Ieithoedd a Diwyllianau Modern ym Mhrifysgol Bangor wedi cael canlyniadau rhagorol yn yr Arolwg Cenedlaethol Myfyrwyr ac yn y Fframwaith Rhagoriaeth Ymchwil (REF) dros y blynyddoedd diwethaf. Yn y panel REF ar gyfer Ieithoedd Modern ac Ieithyddiaeth, daeth Bangor i safle 13 yn y Deyrnas Unedig. Mae'r Adran Ieithoedd Modern a Diwyllianau yn cynnal diwylliant ymchwil bywiog gyda phroffil rhyngwladol, ac ,ae'r staff academiaidd wedi sefydlu projectau o bwys yn unigol ac ar y cyd ag eraill ym meysydd hanes, diwyllianau a gwleidyddiaeth y byd Ffrengig, Sbaenaidd, Almaenaidd ac Eidalaid, gydag arbenigedd cynyddol mewn Astudiaethau Cyfieithu ac Astudiaethau Dwyrain Asia. Mae ymchwil yn yr Ysgol yn canolbwyntio ar ystod o bynciau rhyng-ddiwyllianol a rhyng-gyfringol, gan edrych hefyd ar amrywiaeth eang o safbwyntiau diwyllianol penodol. Mae'r Adain Eidaleg yn un o bum adain iaith yn yr Adran Ieithoedd a Diwyllianau Modern, lle dysgir Ffrangeg, Almaeneg a Sbaeneg i lefel Anrhydedd Sengl a Chyd-anrhydedd ac Eidaleg a Tsieinëeg i lefel Cyd-anrhydedd. Mae'r Ysgol hefyd wedi creu cynllun gradd tair iaith arloesol a phoblogaidd iawn, ac mae'n cynnig nifer gynyddol o raglenni gradd ar y cyd gydag ystod eang o Ysgolion ar draws y brifysgol.

Funded PhD studentship

Bangor University's School of Arts, Culture and Language invites applications for a PhD Studentship **commencing 1st January 2022**.

The successful candidate will be expected to undertake a full-time PhD in an element of Italian culture, literature and society (preferably 20th century and contemporary), and will be given the opportunity to participate on Bangor University's *THE* scheme; fees waived throughout. Stipend: £14,000 per annum. The studentship is available until 31st December 2024 (with an option to extend for a further year).

A condition of this studentship will be that the successful candidate provides assistance with teaching duties in the Italian section of the Department of Modern Languages and Cultures. This will primarily involve providing language teaching, developing teaching resources, and marking assignments and will not exceed 16 hours a week.

Candidates should have at least an undergraduate degree (BA or equivalent) and have an excellent level of fluency in Italian, as well as ambition to pursue research to doctoral level. (*further details below – see 'Specification'*)

Modern Languages & Cultures at Bangor University has received excellent results in both the National Student Survey (NSS) and the Research Excellence Framework (REF) over the past years. In the REF panel for Modern Languages and Linguistics, Bangor was rated 13th in the UK. The Department of Modern Languages & Cultures hosts a vibrant research culture with an international profile, and academic staff have established major individual and collaborative projects in the histories, cultures and politics of the Francophone, Hispanic, German and Italian-speaking worlds, with a growing specialism in Translation Studies and East Asian Studies. Research in the School offers an intercultural and intermedial focus whilst also retaining a broad range of culture-specific perspectives. The Italian Section is one of five language sections in Modern Languages & Cultures, where French, German and Spanish are taught to Single and Joint Honours level and Italian and Chinese to Joint Honours level. The School has also pioneered an innovative and very popular three-language degree scheme, and offers a growing number of joint degree programmes with a wide range of Schools across the university.

MAIN DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Research: The successful candidate will be expected to register for a PhD in an element of Italian culture, literature and society. Research specialisms in the Italian section include Italian Southern Cultures, Literatures and Identities (in particular Sicilian); History of the Italian Language and Italian Linguistics; Contemporary Italian literature, culture and history; Cultural Studies and Organised Crime. Comparative or interdisciplinary topics will also be considered. Fees are waived throughout.

Teaching duties will include:

- Assisting with module teaching and improving the Italian language skills of undergraduate students;
- Marking assignments and provide support with assessment as required;
- Motivating students to proactive engagement in learning, and provide meaningful and constructive feedback on the quality of their work;
- Assisting with small groups of undergraduate students;
- Assisting with the development of teaching resources;
- Maintaining and developing Scholarly activities in line with University and College strategies.

Administrative duties will include:

- Participating in the student recruitment and induction procedures of the School;
- Participating in the administration of undergraduate and postgraduate programmes;
- Contributing to the marketing of programmes by participating in School and College link activities and other marketing initiatives;
- Undertaking other administrative duties and responsibilities as directed by the Head of School.

Other Duties and Responsibilities:

- The successful candidate will be expected to participate in developmental activities and to comply with the University's equality policies and statements, Dignity at Work and Study Policy and the University's Welsh Language Scheme.
