

Information about the Teacher Training Pathway (TTP) for those who have completed Teaching 2 on the CMRP Masters programme.

It is possible to gain the “Certificate of Teaching Competence” in two ways after you have passed Teaching 2; either through the **ATP module** or by doing **Part 2:B of the TTP**. The Certificate is exactly the same no matter which one you do.

How do I join Part 2:B?

To gain a place on Part 2:B you need to a) have passed the Teaching 2 module, and b) have completed the Teacher Training Retreat 2 (TTR2). It doesn't matter which TTR2 you do, there are none especially connected to Part 2:B.

Once you have passed Teaching 2 and completed a TTR2, you can then register on Part 2:B by emailing lisa at mastersinmindfulness@bangor.ac.uk and request the link so you can register straight onto part 2:B (note that this link is not available to the general public because it is just for Masters students who want to do Part 2:B, so it is completely different to the TTP registration link on the website).

When can I register and what are the fees?

There are two intakes per year, one in September and one in January. The module lasts for about five months. If you register in September you need to hand in everything by the end of the following January, if you register in January you have until the end of May to submit everything. The module is run each semester rather than each year which is a little different to the Masters course.

The fee for the module is £872 (as of time of writing February 2017)

Are there any teaching days to attend with part 2:B?

Yes, the ‘Professional and Ethical Issues for Mindfulness Teachers’ is a one-day workshop. This is very different to the similarly-titled day on the Masters programme so attendance on this is compulsory. The fees for this are included in the overall module fee. They run twice a year (one in London, one in Midlands) so before registering check that you can attend the assigned teaching day during the period you will be doing the part 2:B. Which recordings of the 8-week course can I submit?

You can submit a recording of your teaching practice that can be up to 12 months old by the time you submit. Criteria about how to record are clearly written in the TTP handbook which is available online. You must read this before attempting to record an 8 week course you are planning to submit for evaluation. Remember you need written permission from your course participants for recording if this is going to be submitted for evaluation.

Is there a written piece?

Yes, a report about the 8-week course needs to be submitted. The word count is 1500 words.
