

Parry Williams Doctoral Studentship in Music 2019

The School of Music and Media is inviting applications for the Parry Williams Doctoral Studentship in Music.

This award is named after D. E. Parry Williams (1900-1996), the first Professor of Music at Bangor; it is funded by an endowment at the University in his memory. For almost two decades now, the Parry Williams fund has supported excellent postgraduate students in Music. The successful student will be based in the School of Music and Media, Bangor University.

We invite applications from candidates with outstanding research potential in any area of music, but especially for doctoral projects that fall within the remit of staff research interests (including musicology, composition, electroacoustic composition, sonic art and performance). Applications are particularly welcome from students working in D. E. Parry Williams's own specialist areas: Welsh music and composition.

As a PhD student in Bangor, you would be part of a lively and close-knit scholarly environment, in which musicological and practice-based research take equally important roles. Established in 1884, Bangor University benefits from its stunning geographical location between the Snowdonia National Park and the North Wales coast, and has excellent transport links to London (3 hours by train), the north west of England and the Midlands, and the Republic of Ireland.

How will I be funded? The award will consist of a bursary of £10,000 per annum for a period of three years, as a contribution towards tuition fees and maintenance.

Am I eligible to apply? To be eligible prospective students must fulfil the conditions for doctoral study at Bangor University. The successful candidate will be expected to take up their studies at Bangor in the autumn of 2019 or as soon as possible thereafter.

The scholarship is open to both UK national, EU and international candidates.

- (a) A research proposal (research question, context, methodology, expected outcomes)
- (b) A personal statement setting out previous experience in the field and preparedness for the task
- (c) An explanation of how the project links with the research environment and staff expertise at Bangor
- (d) Samples of your previous work
- (e) A detailed CV setting out your academic achievements so far

Efrydiaeth Ddoethurol Parry Williams mewn Cerddoriaeth 2019

Mae'r Ysgol Cerddoriaeth yn gwahodd ceisiadau ar gyfer Efrydiaeth Ddoethurol Parry Williams mewn Cerddoriaeth.

Mae'r efrydiaeth hon wedi'i henwi ar ôl D. E. Parry Williams (1900-1996), Pennaeth Cerddoriaeth cyntaf Bangor; cyllidir hi trwy waddol yn y Brifysgol er cof amdano. Ers mwy na degawd bellach, mae cronfa Parry Williams wedi cynnal myfyrwyr cerddoriaeth ôl-raddedig rhagorol. Bydd y myfyriwr llwyddiannus yn gweithio yn yr Ysgol Cerddoriaeth a'r Cyfryngau, Prifysgol Bangor.

Mae'r Ysgol yn gwahodd ceisiadau gan ymgeiswyr sydd â phosibiliadau neilltuol o ran ymchwil mewn unrhyw faes o fewn cerddoriaeth, ond yn enwedig ar gyfer prosiectau doethurol sydd o fewn meysydd diddordebau'r staff (gan gynnwys cerddoreg, cyfansoddi, cyfansoddi electroacwstig, celfyddydau sonig a pherfformio). Mae croeso arbennig i geisiadau gan fyfyrwyr sy'n gweithio ym meysydd arbenigol David Parry Williams ei hun: Cerddoriaeth Gymreig a chyfansoddi.

Fel myfyriwr PhD ym Mangor, byddech yn rhan o amgylchedd ysgolheigaidd bywiog ac agos, lle mae ymchwil gerddoregol ac ymchwil seiliedig ar ymarfer yr un mor bwysig â'i gilydd. A hithau wedi'i sefydlu ym 1884, saif Prifysgol Bangor mewn lleoliad godidog rhwng Parc Cenedlaethol Eryri ac arfordir Gogledd Cymru, ac mae ganddi gysylltiadau trafniadol gwych â Llundain (3 awr yn y trê), gogledd-orllewin a chanolbarth Lloegr, a Gweriniaeth Iwerddon.

Sut byddaf yn cael fy ariannu? Bydd yr efrydiaeth yn cynnwys bwrsariaeth o £10,000 y flwyddyn am gyfnod o 3 blynedd, fel cyfraniad tuag at ffioedd dysgu a chynnal a chadw.

Ydw i'n gymwys i wneud cais? I fod yn gymwys, rhaid i ddarpar-fyfyrwyr ateb yr amodau ar gyfer astudiaeth ddoethurol ym Mhrifysgol Bangor. Bydd disgwyl i'r ymgeisydd llwyddiannus gychwyn ar ei (h)astudiaethau ym Mangor yn hydref 2019 neu cyn gynted ag y bo modd wedyn.

Mae'r efrydiaeth yn agored i ymgeiswyr cenedlaethol a rhyngwladol, fel ei gilydd.
