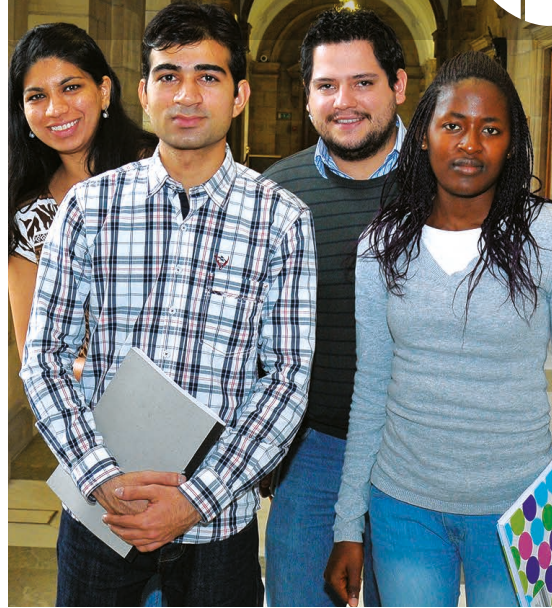

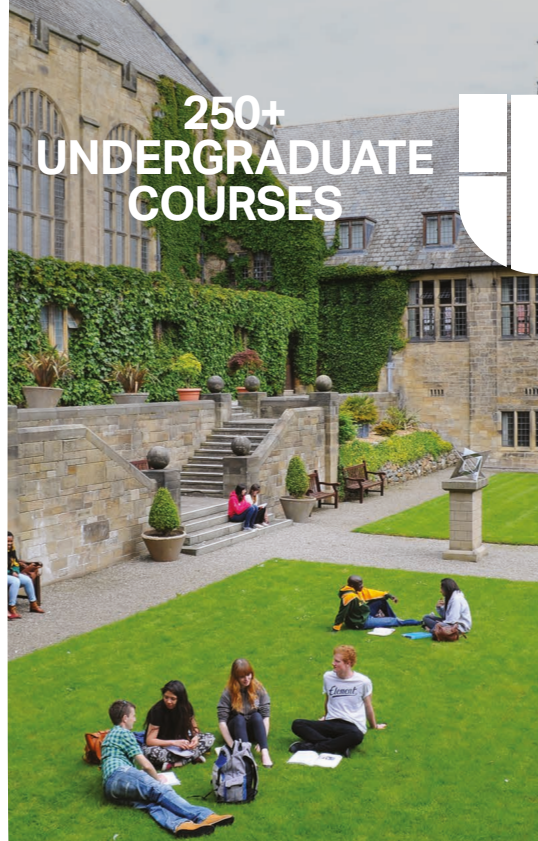

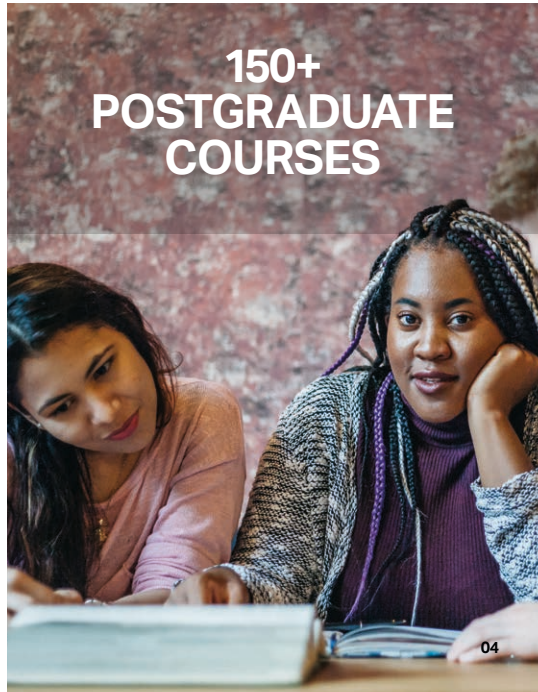

# Dr Ephraim Kisangala, from Uganda

**MSc Public Health  
and Health Promotions Alumni**

Having been practicing as a GP for two years in his home country of Uganda, Ephraim decided that the time was right to develop his experience and to extend his education. Dr Kisangala, a Commonwealth Scholar was nominated for his Scholarship by the Windle Trust International, a charity that promotes education among people affected by conflicts and refugees.

Ephraim was involved in the first world campaign on menstrual hygiene management in 2014 while he was a medical student. He and a group of fellow young professionals contribute from their monthly salaries to fund visits to rural areas with no access to healthcare, to provide free healthcare services to the people in the hardest to reach areas through a local based organisation called Nyalojjie Integrated Foundation (NIF).

“My time at Bangor University remains memorable. Being a multi-national university, I felt at home when I arrived for the first time in the UK and found fellow Ugandans /Africans at the University. My lecturers were very, very supportive, mentoring me all the way, and regularly checking the progress of the projects I had set myself to do. Even now, I'm still in regular contact with the faculty. I still feel connected to the university even though I completed my studies at the end of 2019”.



## Dr Ephraim Kisangala meets Meghan, Duchess of Sussex

During his time at Bangor University Ephraim presented at the Conference of the Association of Commonwealth Universities in London where he presented on menstrual hygiene management among refugees in Uganda. At the conference, Ephraim was invited to meet Meghan, Duchess of Sussex, and she showed particular interest in his work, it was also announced at the same event that the Duchess would become the Association's Royal Patron.



## ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

### UNDERGRADUATE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

A school leaving qualification which is equivalent to the British school leaving qualification e.g A-levels / International Baccalaureate.

If you do not have the above qualification, then we can consider you for entry onto one of our 4-year International Incorporated Bachelor degree (IIB) programmes. Refer to pages 21-22 for more details.

### POSTGRADUATE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

An undergraduate / Bachelor degree of equivalent standard to the British undergraduate/ Bachelor degree with a minimum grade equivalent to a British second-class honours.

If you do not qualify for entry onto the masters degrees in our School of Business or Psychology then you could consider applying for our International Incorporated Masters degrees (IIM). Refer to pages 21-22 for more details.

## ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

### Evidence of Language proficiency

The required evidence can be from any of the following:

- IELTS (SELT or Non-SELT) or IELTS Indicator (tests taken from 1st July 2020 onwards)
- International English Language Competency Assessment
- Pearson PTE Academic & PTE Academic Online
- Cambridge English Language Assessment
- Trinity College London – ISE II & III
- Duolingo English Test - Online Test
- TOEFL iBT
- LanguageCert International ESOL
- China - CET6, TEM4, and TEM8
- BUELT - Bangor University English Language Test
- Trinity ISE I, II, III
- KITE Online English Test
- Oxford International English Language Level Test

### Exemptions:

Your English language requirement may be waived if you;

Are a citizen of a majority English-speaking country.

Have graduated from university in a majority English-speaking country, within the last 2 years.

Have achieved good grades in your high school English, or a letter from your university confirming your bachelor degree was taught in English.

### Required score:

The level of English required depends on the course you wish to apply for. Most of our courses require an IELTS score of 6.0 (5.5), however, some courses require a higher score.

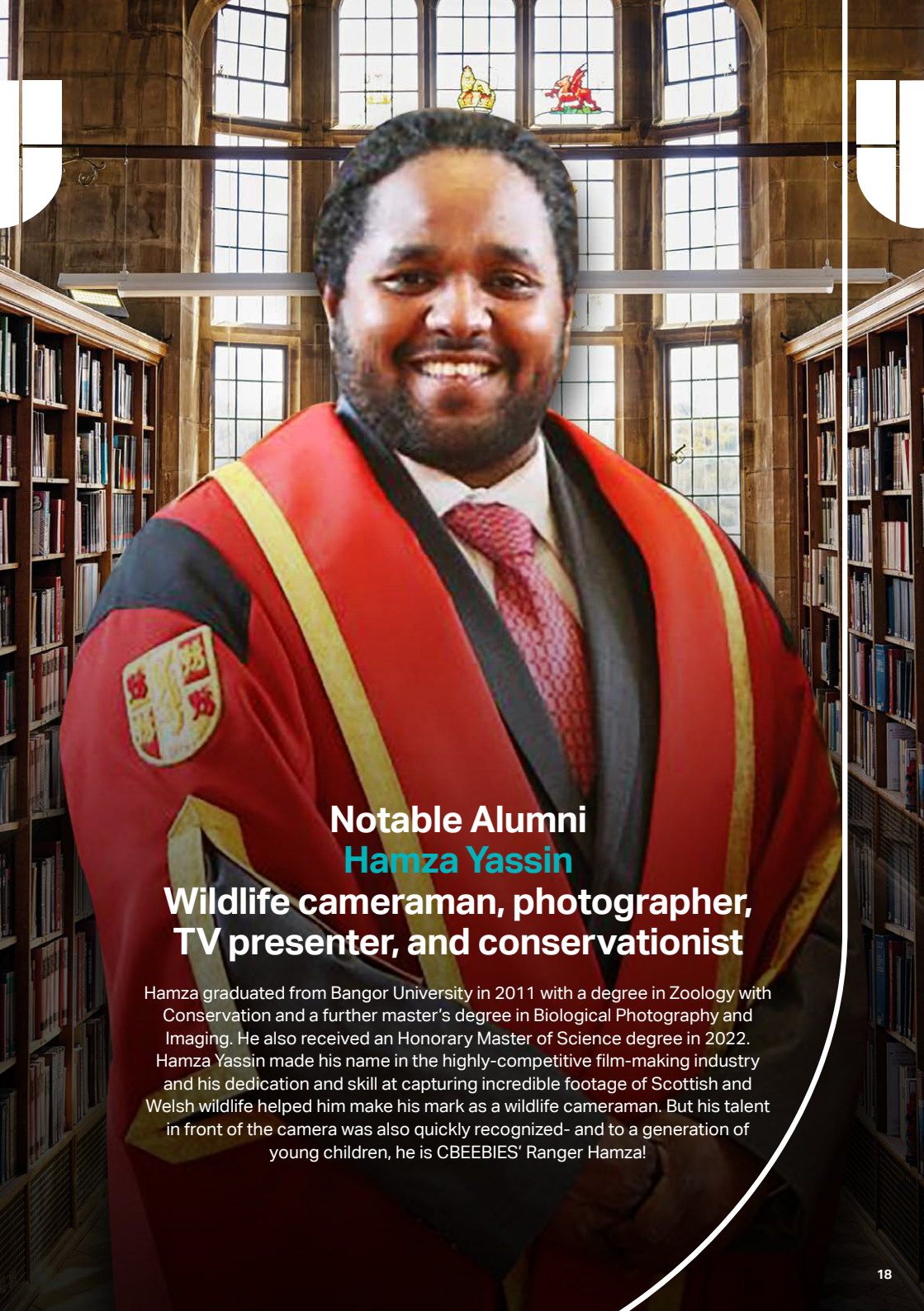

# BANGOR UNIVERSITY INTERNATIONAL COLLEGE

## International incorporated Bachelor's degree (IIB)

A four-year degree option at Bangor university for students whose high school qualification isn't equivalent to those in the UK. International Year Zero (IYZ) is the first stage of a four-year IIB degree and is delivered at Bangor University International College, students then progress onto their academic degree at Bangor university.

You can choose to study one of the following routes:

Business, Management and Economics  
Engineering and Computer Science  
Law, Media, Psychology, and Social Sciences

Students can start the IYZ in September or January. An option for April is available to study the IYZ followed by the International Year One (IYZ) for transition to Bangor's year 2.

## International year 1 (IY1)

The International Year 1 (IY1), delivered at Bangor University International College (BUIC) provides an intensive combination of first year university subject areas with entry routes to business, management, finance and psychology and includes extra study and English language skills.

Upon successful completion of the IY1, you will continue to the second year of your chosen degree at Bangor university.

Students can start the IY1 course in September or January.



## International Incorporated Masters

Our IIM programmes focus on psychology and business subjects including accounting, banking, business, finance, investment, management, and marketing and will equip you with the advanced skills you need to complete your postgraduate study at Bangor university.

This intergrated pre-masters is for students that have not met our entry requirements for the masters programmes.

For non-business or psychology subjects you will need to complete a relevant pre-masters with another provider.

## Pre-sessional English Programmes

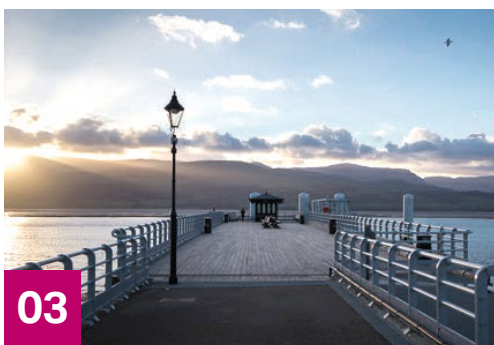
