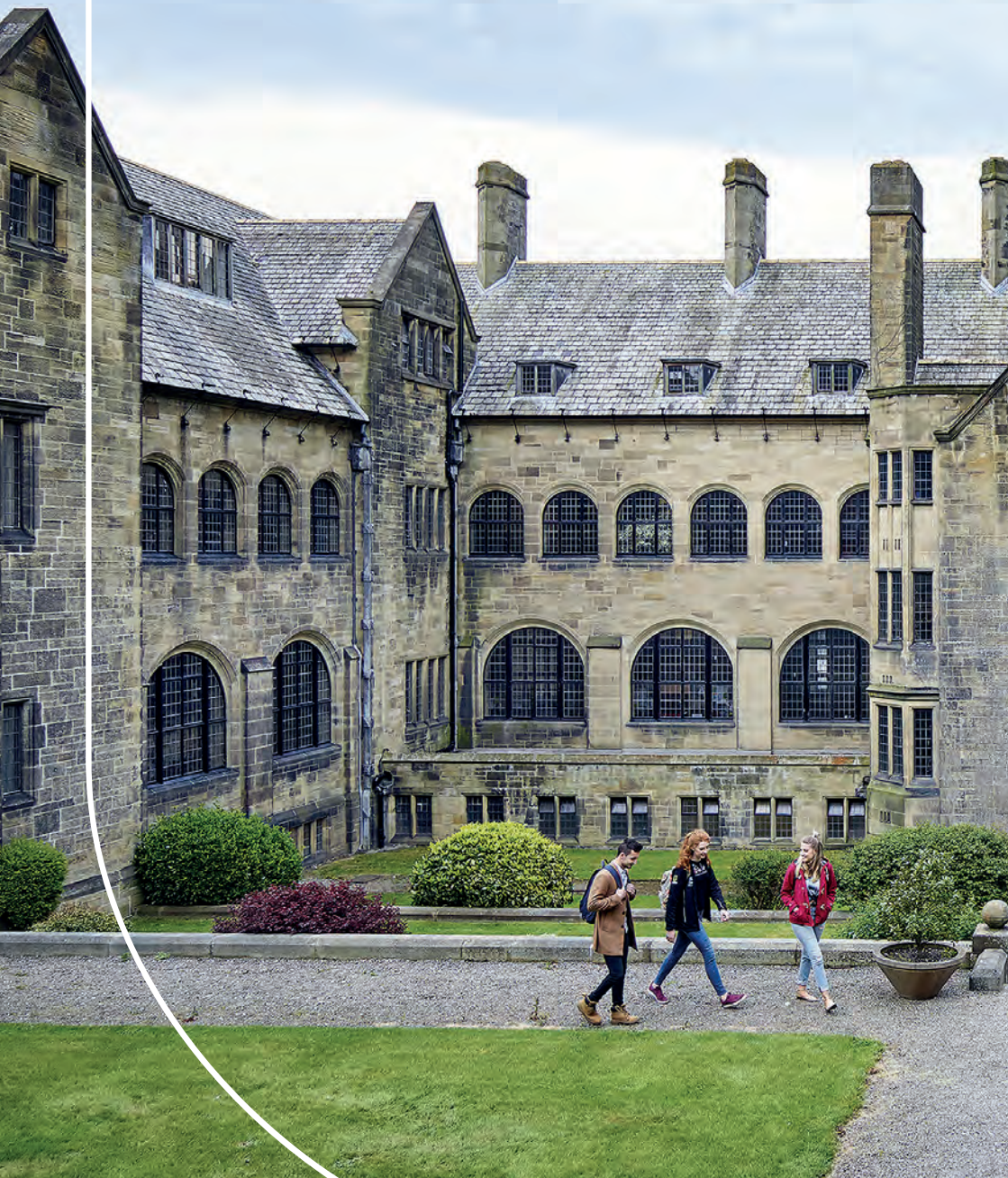

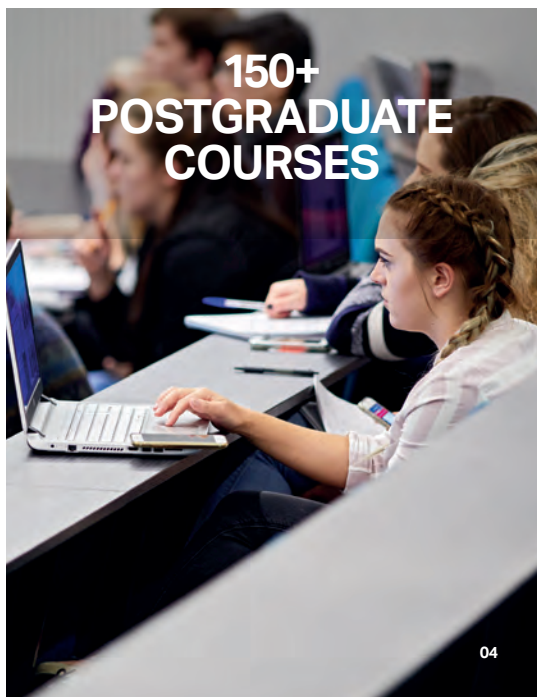

Dr Ephraim Kisangala, from Uganda

**MSc Public Health
and Health Promotions Alumni**

Having been practicing as a GP for two years in his home country of Uganda, Ephraim decided that the time was right to develop his experience and to extend his education. Dr Kisangala, a Commonwealth Scholar was nominated for his Scholarship by the Windle Trust International, a charity that promotes education among people affected by conflicts and refugees.

Ephraim was involved in the first world campaign on menstrual hygiene management in 2014 while he was a medical student. He and a group of fellow young professionals contribute from their monthly salaries to fund visits to rural areas with no access to healthcare, to provide free healthcare services to the people in the hardest to reach areas through a local based organisation called Nyalojjie Integrated Foundation (NIF).

"My time at Bangor University remains memorable. Being a multi-national university, I felt at home when I arrived for the first time in the UK and found fellow Ugandans /Africans at the University. My lecturers were very, very supportive, mentoring me all the way, and regularly checking the progress of the projects I had set myself to do. Even now, I'm still in regular contact with the faculty. I still feel connected to the university even though I completed my studies at the end of 2019".



ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

UNDERGRADUATE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

A school leaving qualification which is equivalent to the British school leaving qualification e.g A-levels / International Baccalaureate.

If you do not have the above qualification, then we can consider you for entry onto one of our 4-year International Incorporated Bachelor degree (IIB) programmes. Refer to pages 21-22 for more details.

POSTGRADUATE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

An undergraduate / Bachelor degree of equivalent standard to the British undergraduate/ Bachelor degree with a minimum grade equivalent to a British second-class honours.

If you do not qualify for entry onto the masters degrees in our School of Business or Psychology then you could consider applying for our International Incorporated Masters degrees (IIM). Refer to pages 21-22 for more details.

POSTGRADUATE TAUGHT ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

A Postgraduate / Master's Degree of equivalent standard to the British Postgraduate / Master's Degree.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

Evidence of Language proficiency

The required evidence can be from any of the following:

- **BUELT - Bangor University English Language Test**
- IELTS (SELT or Non-SELT)
- International English Language Competency Assessment
- Pearson PTE Academic & PTE Academic Online
- Cambridge English Language Assessment
- Trinity College London – ISE II & III
- TOEFL iBT
- LanguageCert International ESOL
- China - CET6, TEM4, and TEM8
- Trinity ISE I, II, III
- KITE Online English Test

Exemptions:

Your English language requirement may be waived if you;

- Are a citizen of a majority English-speaking country.
- Have graduated from university in a majority English-speaking country, within the last 2 years.
- Have achieved good grades in your high school English, or a letter from your university confirming your bachelor degree was taught in English.

REQUIRED SCORE:

The level of English required depends on the course you wish to apply for.

Most of our courses require an IELTS score of 6.0 (5.5), however, some courses require a higher score.

Notable Alumni **Hamza Yassin**

Wildlife cameraman, photographer, TV presenter, and conservationist

Hamza graduated from Bangor University in 2011 with a degree in Zoology with Conservation and a further master's degree in Biological Photography and Imaging. He also received an Honorary Master of Science degree in 2022.

Hamza Yassin made his name in the highly-competitive film-making industry and his dedication and skill at capturing incredible footage of Scottish and Welsh wildlife helped him make his mark as a wildlife cameraman. But his talent in front of the camera was also quickly recognized- and to a generation of young children, he is CBEEBIES' Ranger Hamza!

He was also crowned the 2022 champion of Strictly Come Dancing, a British dance contest show in which celebrities partner with professional dancers to compete in mainly ballroom and Latin dance.

All programmes taken at the college are validated by Bangor University and delivered by Oxford International Education Group.

BANGOR UNIVERSITY INTERNATIONAL COLLEGE

International Incorporated Bachelor's degree (IIB)

A four-year degree option at Bangor university for students whose high school qualification isn't equivalent to those in the UK. International Year Zero (IYZ) is the first stage of a four-year IIB degree and is delivered at Bangor University International College, students then progress onto their academic degree at Bangor university.

You can choose to study one of the following routes:

- Business, Management & Economics
- Engineering & Computer Science
- Law, Media & Social Sciences
- Psychology

Students can start the IYZ in September or January.

International Year 1 (IY1)

The International Year 1 (IY1), delivered at Bangor University International College (BUIC) provides an intensive combination of first year university subject areas with entry routes to:

- *Business & Management

- *Psychology

and includes extra study and English language skills.

Upon successful completion of the IY1, you will continue to the second year of your chosen degree at Bangor university.

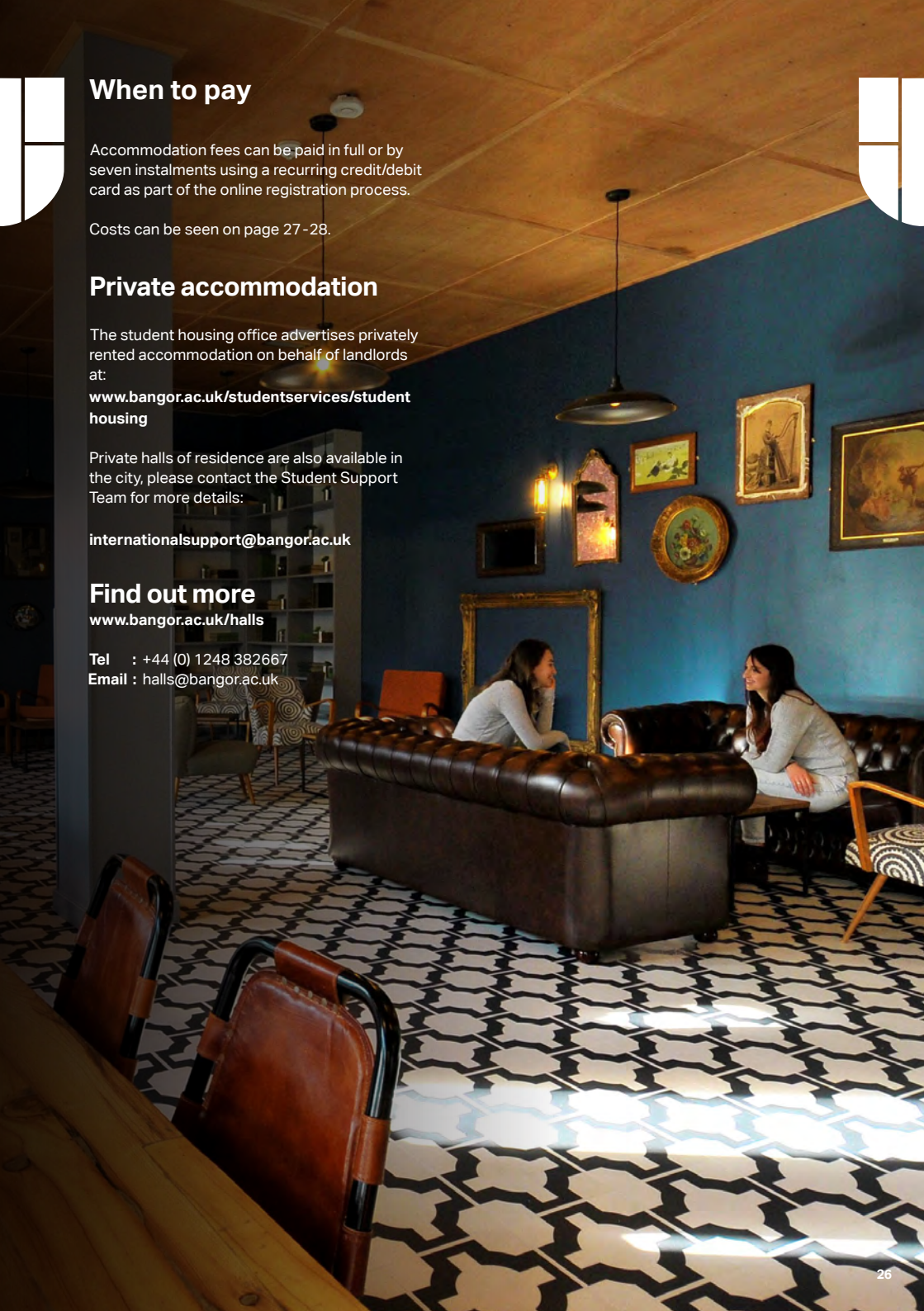

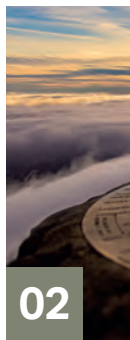

Travelling to Bangor

Bangor is a university city located on the North Wales coast between the mountains of Snowdonia and the sea. The nearest airports are Manchester (2 hours), London (3.5 hours) and Liverpool (1.5 hours). An Airport pick-up service is available from Manchester Airport on set dates. A train line links Bangor to the rest of the UK.

Travelling within Bangor

Everything in Bangor can be reached on foot, students do not need to rely on public transport. Libraries, lecture theatres, seminar rooms and other academic buildings are located close to each other and within walking distance of the city centre and university accommodation.

Cost of living
