

DONATION AGREEMENT

CYMEN and Bangor University

1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this agreement is to summarize the mutual understanding between CYMEN (The Donor) and Bangor University regarding their donation of £8,250 (full time) or £8,262 (part time) to support student/students on a taught MSc through a Scholarship in the Department of Linguistics, which is part of the School of Arts, Culture and Language. The agreement will be made as part of Bangor University's permanent records and the intention is that it will be a guide for those who will administer the money given now and in the future.

2. BANGOR UNIVERSITY

Bangor University is a Registered Charity number 1141565

3. DESCRIPTION OF THE DONATION

Through the donation, the donor wishes to show their support for Bangor University through funding the fees of one full-time student or two part-time students through a taught MSc Degree Scholarship in Language Technologies through the medium of Welsh. The donation will be known as the "Cymen Scholarship".

4. USES AND LIMITATIONS OF THE DONATION

The donation will be used and distributed as follows:

- a. The donations will fund the tuition fees of one full-time or part-time student over two years through a taught MSc Degree Scholarship in Language Technologies through the medium of Welsh.
- b. The donation will be known as the "Cymen Scholarship"
- c. The recipients will comply with all Bangor University rules and regulations.

5. REPORTING TO THE DONOR

Recipients are required to acknowledge the donor's support in their Dissertation/Thesis. The Linguistics Department will inform the donor of the progress of the student(s).

6. CONSIDERATIONS AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS WITH REGARDS TO NAMING

The Scholarship will be known as the "Cymen Scholarship". It is listed on Bangor University's List of Donors and there may be references to it in the University's marketing materials and publications.

7. SELECTION OF THE SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENT

The application and selection process at Bangor University is the responsibility of the representative of the Language Technologies Unit, namely either Gruff Prys or Stefano Ghazzali, MSC Course Director, Marco Tamburelli and Cymen's representative either Manon Cadwaladr or Aled Jones. The successful candidate will be chosen on the basis of academic merit and may be from the United Kingdom or internationally but he/she will be required to study through the medium of Welsh.

8. ADMINISTRATION OF THE DONATION


The donation will be managed by the finance department in accordance with the University's finance policies.

9. UNEXPECTED CIRCUMSTANCES



10. HOW TO APPLY: GUIDANCE NOTES


In the online application system complete the sections as required, under the programme tab select **Postgraduate/ Taught masters.**

Then under the 'Finance' tab you need to select Bangor University advertised studentship and manually enter Cymen Scholaship in the 'Enter name of studentship' field. Also need to specify 'no' not awarded yet in the Have you been awarded the funding? Field.
