Ffriddoedd is our largest accommodation village and is located in Upper Bangor, a thriving student area. It's about a 5-minute walk from the train station, and a 10-minute walk from the Main University Building or city centre.

ST MARY'S VILLAGE

St Mary's is the smaller student village, located in an elevated position overlooking the city of Bangor. It is about a 5-minute walk from the city centre and a 15-minute walk from the train station and the Main University Building.
