Hello everyone and welcome to our latest online newsletter.


We had a busy end to 2024 with our first Community Day at Bangor University and a really successful conference at Penpont in Breconshire. Thanks so much to those of you who supported these events. Since the beginning of 2025 we've started work on three exciting new projects. Thanks to digitisation funding from the Welsh Government, we're going to be able to make the hugely significant Jamaica papers held within the Penrhyn estate archives more accessible to communities in Wales and around the world. We're also pleased to be part of an interdisciplinary research project focusing on the history and future of herring in the waters around Wales: these once-abundant fish were really important to the social and economic lives of many of our coastal estates and communities. And we're also delighted to be working with the National Trust on an oral history project focussing on the skills, work and memories of the generations of gardeners who have made Bodnant such an iconic part of our landscape.

In February we were deeply saddened to hear that Lord Dafydd-Elis Thomas had passed away. Dafydd was a founding member of our Advisory Board, whilst serving as Chancellor of Bangor University, and always remained so interested in our research and projects. He was such a wonderful person to speak to about heritage, place, culture and Wales – and his contribution to Welsh life will be greatly missed. 
ISWE's first annual lecture

We were delighted to welcome Dr Melvin Humphreys to Bangor University on 2nd April for our first ISWE Annual Lecture.

Over recent years Melvin has worked closely with Murray Chapman at the National Library of Wales to catalogue a huge corpus of records relating to the Powis Castle estate. He is now using his knowledge of this archive to write a book on the history of the Powis estate, concentrating on the period from the late-seventeenth to the early-nineteenth centuries. His lecture to ISWE provided an overview of the family and the different estates they held in Wales, England and Ireland, and particularly focused on the interlinked issues of debt, income and inheritance, with important analyses of how land enclosure and lead mining were central to the sustainability of the estate.

Penpont conference explores Welsh country house histories

In November we partnered with the Brecknock Society and Crickhowell District Archive to host a one-day conference on 'Researching, Writing & Presenting Welsh Country House Histories' at Penpont in Brecon, which was a huge success. Nine speakers gave fascinating insights into how they have approached researching and writing Welsh country house histories, including Dr Elizabeth Siberry and Eliane Wigzell, two of the co-authors of the recent publication *Great Houses of Crickhowell*.

There was also strong participation from members of the ISWE team, with Dr Shaun Evans opening the conference with an overview of how Welsh gentry family histories have been recorded and presented over the centuries. Two of our doctoral cohort, Sara Fox and Bethan Scorey, presented papers on the process of editing the monograph *Middleton Hall: A History* and researching the early history of Elizabethan St Fagans Castle, respectively. We also heard about ISWE graduate Dr Mary Oldham's work on the Gregynog estate.

FisHistory: Project ymchwil newydd i ddadansoddi hanes a dyfodol penwaig yn nyfroedd Cymru

FishHistory: New research project to analyse the history and future of herring in Welsh waters

Mae'n bleser gennym fod yn cydweithio â chydweithwyr ag aelodau staff o Ysgol Gwyddorau Eigion Prifysgol Bangor ar proiect ymchwil rhyngddisgyblaethol sy'n canolbwytio ar hanes a dyfodol penwaig yn y moroedd o amgylch Cymru.

Roedd penwaig yr Iwerydd yn elfen sylfaenol bwysig o ecosystem Môr Iwerddon, ac yn nodwedd amlwg ym mywydau cymunedau arfordirol Cymru, nes i boblogaeth y rhywogaeth ostwng yng nghanol yr 20fed ganrif. Bydd y proiect yn nodi archifau hanesyddol a gwybodaeth yn ymwneud â phenwaig ac yn archwilio ffyrrd o wneud defnydd o'r wybodaeth hanesyddol hon i lywio rheolaeth gynaliadwy ar y moroedd yn y dyfodol.

We are delighted to be collaborating with Bangor University colleagues from the School of Ocean Sciences on an interdisciplinary research project which focuses on the history and future of herring in seas around Wales.

Atlantic herring were a fundamentally important component of the marine ecosystem of the Irish Sea, and a prominent feature in the lives of Welsh coastal communities, until the species suffered a population collapse in the mid-20th century. The project will identify historical archives and information relating to herring and explore ways of making use of this historical knowledge to inform sustainable ocean management in the future.

Project hanes llafar i gofnodi traddodiad garddio ym Modnant

Mae Sefydliad Ymchwil Ystadau Cymru yn falch iawn o weithio mewn partneriaeth gyda'r Ymddiriedolaeth Genedlaethol ar proiect hanes llafar newydd cyffrous i gofnodi atgofion garddwyr ddoe a heddiw yng Ngardd Bodnant yn Nyffryn Conwy. Mae llawer o'r garddwyr cyfredol wedi gweithio ar y safle ers bron i ddeugain mlynedd ac mae'r proiect hwn yn cydnabod y dylid dogfennu a dathlu bywydau a phrofiadau'r unigolion hyn, a'u hymgorffori'n llawnach yn 'stori' Bodnant, a sut caiff y stori honno ei chyflwyno i wyr hymwelwyr. Oral history project to capture gardening tradition at Bodnant

ISWE is delighted to be partnering with the National Trust on an exciting new oral history project to capture memories of gardeners past and present at Bodnant Garden in the Conwy Valley. Many of the current gardeners have worked at the site for almost forty years, and this project recognises that the lives and experiences of these individuals should be documented, celebrated and incorporated more fully into the 'story' of Bodnant and how it is presented to its visitors. Two postgraduate Oral History Research Interns, Anna Reynolds and Sam Trethouen-Haycox have been appointed to create oral history recordings and an archive of historical photographs and memorabilia. It is hoped that the collected material will be used for enhanced heritage interpretation and community engagement at Bodnant.

Our postgraduate interns, Anna Reynolds and Sam Trethouen-Haycox, are now looking forward to commencing the interviews this spring, many of which will take place on site in Bodnant to enrich the context.'



continued support and guidance, including as a member of our Advisory Board.

His lecture topic was 'Closed for Research: The Irish Land Commission Archives and the Fall of the Anglo-Irish Aristocracy'. This brought together Terry's expertise on landed estates and the aristocracy in the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries, together with his seminal research on the politics of land in Ireland. However, his primary focus was the Irish Land Commission, its role, function and influence, but especially the outstanding historical source material preserved in its archives. These records are currently 'closed for research'. Terry is urging the Irish Government to reconsider this stance, and open up a potentially unparalleled resource for understanding the social history of Ireland.

The excellent lecture provided an opportunity for University Archivist, Elen Wyn Simpson, to reflect on the importance of making the records held by Bangor University Archives as accessible as possible for research and teaching. As always, the Annual Lecture received fantastic support, with a packed lecture theatre. Thank you so much to everyone who came along.

We have recently learned that Prof. Dooley has been appointed a Member of the Royal Irish Academy, in recognition of his contribution to Irish scholarship and academia. We wholeheartedly congratulate him on his outstanding achievement.

New App Recreates Margam Interiors

In other news at Margam Castle, a ground-breaking new app called 'M[AR]gam' has been launched which allows visitors to explore the long-lost Library and Dining Room in all their Victorian splendour, either in-situ as an augmented reality experience or remotely. The Margam Interiors project is a collaboration between Neath Port Talbot Council, CFP Landscape and Heritage Consultancy, and the Centre for Heritage Research and Training (CHART) at Swansea University, and was awarded a UK Shared Prosperity fund in February 2024. National Library Exhibition Destroys 'No Welsh Art' Myth

November saw the opening of a new exhibition called 'No Welsh Art' at the National Library of Wales, curated by art historian and long-time friend of ISWE, Peter Lord. Since the 1980s, Peter has been continuously challenging the myth that there is 'no Welsh art' – an assertion which originated with Llewelyn Wyn Griffith in 1950 – by discovering and recording Welsh artists, artworks and schemes of visual culture and display. This pioneering exhibition tells the narrative of Wales through visual art, comprising 150 pieces from Lord's private collection, many of which are on public display for the first time, and 100 pieces from the National Art Collection held by the National Library of Wales. Several pieces with intricate associations with Welsh country houses and estates are included. 'No Welsh Art' runs until 6th September 2025 and Peter Lord is leading monthly guided tours. ISWE is deeply concerned about the future of two nationally important, Grade I-listed country houses: Nanteos in Cardiganshire and Plas Teg in Flintshire. Nanteos near Aberystwyth closed its doors in early March, having operated as a hotel since 2012. Elsewhere, it has been reported that Cornelia Bayley, owner of Plas Teg, who for nearly forty years has worked tirelessly to save the outstandingly important Jacobean house, has vacated the property and removed the contents of the house for sale at auction by Rogers Jones. Both houses have seen major restorations in recent decades, and Plas Teg again requires major renovation works. Both houses now face uncertain futures. Regrettably these are not stand-alone cases. There remain significant concerns about the futures of Llancaich Fawr and Plas Tan-y-Bwlch following Caerphilly County Borough Council's decision to 'mothball' the former, and Eryri National Park Authority's public consultation on and sale listing of the latter.

New Crowdsourcing Project to Identify Pennant Images

Our friends at the [Curious Travellers project](#) have launched a crowdsourcing project called 'Picturing Pennant' to improve digital access to the naturalist and antiquarian Thomas Pennant's eighteenth-century Tours of Wales and Scotland. As well as his printed publications, Pennant also compiled bespoke, hand-illustrated volumes for his own personal use, all of which have now been digitised and made available online by the National Library of Wales. The goal of the project is to link the text in the printed volumes to the relevant images in the illustrated volumes, and the project partners are inviting the public to help online. Welsh Culture Report Highlights Enormous Missed Opportunity

In January the Senedd's Culture and Sport Committee published a deeply concerning report on the state of the cultural and heritage sectors in Wales. The report outlines the impact that a decade of relentless funding cuts has had on the nation's arts, culture, heritage and sport, and finds that following these cuts, Wales ranks second from bottom of European countries in terms of spending per person on cultural services. These cuts have resulted in redundancies at Amgueddfa Cymru and significant pressures on other essential national institutions such as RCAHMW and the National Library. We urge the Welsh Government to

Out and About

Public and community engagement is really important to our identity as a research centre and we encourage our doctoral cohort to share their research widely.

Rhoddodd Scott a Jon gyflwyniad i'r amrywiol projectau mapio digidol sy'n cael eu datblygu gan Gomisiwn Brenhinol Henebion Cymru, gan gynnwys mentrau a ddatblygwyd o'n gwaith cydweithredol 'Archifau Ystadau: Mapio Amlhaenog' yng ngogledd ddwyrain Cymru.

Rydym yn bwriadu cynnal seminarau ymchwil pellach yn ystod 2025 felly cadwch lygad am hysbysiadau. Mae bob amser yn wych gweld cymaint o bobl yn teithio i Fangor i ddod i'r digwyddiadau hyn: rydym yn gwerthfawrogi'r ymdrech yn fawr.

Bethan Scorey is looking forward to presenting a talk about three generations of Windsor-Clive women and their impact on the gardens of St Fagans Castle to the Welsh Historic Gardens Trust and the Welsh Victorian Society at Insole Court this April.

In February, Dr Lowri Ann Rees delivered a lecture to Anglesey Antiquarian Society on 'Riots in Amlwch', and in the same month our good friend Peter Foden delivered a lecture to Monmouthshire Antiquarian Association on 'Bessy and the Baronet', based on his research into Sir John Williams and the history of Llangibby Castle. Also in February, Dr Meinir Moncrieffe delivered a talk in Criccieth to Cymdeithas Hanes Dyffryn Nantlle on the subject of 'Statws trwy lygaid yr uchelwyr', based on her PhD thesis on the Gwydir estate, and in March gave a talk at Plas Glyn-y-Weddw on 'Invisible lives: Gentry Women in Early Modern Wales'.

ISWE Research Seminars

On 30th January we were delighted to hold a research seminar with Dr Alec Moore from the School of Ocean Sciences. Alec talked about the different strands of research contributing towards his FisHistory work, with an emphasis on how historical sources can be used to inform sustainable ocean ecosystems.

This followed another fantastic research seminar on 21st October, delighted by Scott Lloyd and Jon Dollery on the theme of 'Mapping Wales: Boundaries, Estates and Historic Environment'. Scott and Jon provided an introduction to the various digital mapping projects being developed by RCAHMW, including initiatives developed out of our collaborative 'Deep Mapping Estate Archives' work in north east Wales.

We're looking to hold further research seminars across 2025 so please keep an eye out for notifications. It's always great to see so many people travel to Bangor for these events: we really appreciate it.
