## New Chair appointed for ISWE Board

Mae'n bleser gennym gyhoeddi penodiad yr Athro Carol Tully yn Gadeirydd newydd ein Bwrdd Ymgynghorol. Mae'r Athro Tully yn dod ag arbenigedd academiaidd helaeth i'r rôl: mae hi wedi meithrin enw da rhyngwladol fel ysgolhaig ym maes cyfnewid diwylliannol a llenyddol yn Ewrop yn y bedwaredd ganrif ar bymtheg, ac roedd hi'n Brif Ymchwilydd ar y project nodedig a ariannwyd gan Gyngor Ymchwil y Celfyddydau a'r Dyniaethau (AHRC), *European Travellers to Wales*. **We are delighted to announce the appointment of Prof. Carol Tully as the new Chair of our Advisory Board. Prof. Tully brings extensive academic expertise to the role: she has established an international reputation as a scholar in the area of European cultural and literary exchange in the nineteenth century, and she was Principal Investigator on the landmark AHRC-funded *European Travellers to Wales* project. Carol also brings strong leadership attributes: prior to her retirement in 2025 she served in several leadership roles at Bangor University, and has held several advisory roles with the AHRC.**

**Our Advisory Board, established in 2016, is an external body consisting of experts and community members whose expertise and skills align with ISWE's interests. The Board meets twice a year, and its role is to provide a sounding board for our long-term development and to offer insights and advice on matters relating to our public profile, stakeholder relations, intellectual identity and funding strategies. Work is already underway on an exciting new ten-year Strategic Plan, which will guide ISWE's priorities and vision for the next decade.**

British Agricultural

Mae Dr Shaun Evans wedi ennill Gwobr Goffa Joan Thirsk 2026 gan Gymdeithas Hanes Amaethyddol Prydain am y Llyfr Gorau yn y categori Hanes Gwledig neu Hanes Amaethyddol Prydain neu Iwerddon.

Dyfarwyd y wobr i Shaun am ei lyfr, *Coming of Age Celebrations on Welsh Landed Estates: Gentry, Culture and Society, c.1770–1920*, a gyhoeddwyd gan Boydell & Brewer y llynedd.

Dr Shaun Evans has been awarded the 2026 Joan Thirsk Memorial Prize by the British Agricultural History Society for the Best Book in British or Irish Rural or Agrarian History.

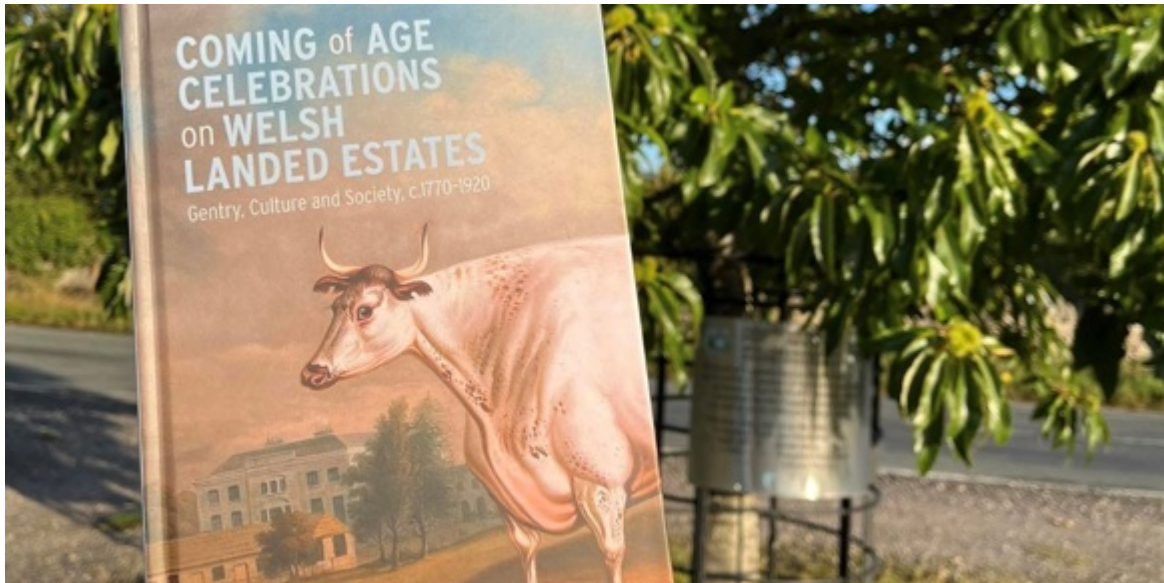
The Prize was awarded for Shaun's book on *Coming of Age Celebrations on Welsh Landed Estates: Gentry, Culture and Society, c.1770–1920*, published by Boydell & Brewer last year.

Wrth ddyfarnu'r wobwr i Dr Evans, nododd y Pwyllgor Gwobrwyo fod Coming of Age Celebrations on Welsh Landed Estates “yn llenwi bwlch sylweddol wrth egluro sut roedd ystadau tiriog yn gweithio yng Nghymru. Drwy ddull rhyngddisgyblaethol sy'n cyfuno dadansoddi ffrensieg â disgrifiadau bywiog, mae Evans yn defnyddio dathliadau dod i oed i ddarparu dealltwriaeth ddiddorol i gymunedau cyfan, gan gynnwys y rhai sydd ar frig ac ar waelod hierarchaethau cymdeithasol.”

In making the award to Dr Evans, the Prize Committee noted that Coming of Age Celebrations on Welsh Landed Estates “fills a significant gap in explaining how landed estates worked in Wales. Through an interdisciplinary approach which combines forensic analysis with vivid descriptions, Evans uses coming of age celebrations to provide a fascinating window onto whole communities, encapsulating those at the top and bottom of social hierarchies.”

## Book Launch: *Coming of Age Celebrations on Welsh Landed Estates*

Ym mis Hydref, daeth cydweithwyr a ffrindiau ynghyd ym Mhrifysgol Bangor i lansio llyfr newydd Dr Shaun Evans, *Coming of Age Celebrations on Welsh Landed Estates: Gentry, Culture and Society, c.1770–1920*. Cyhoeddwyd gan Boydell & Brewer ym mis Medi 2025, mae'r llyfr hwn yn torri tir newydd fel yr astudiaeth gynhwysfawr gyntaf o ddathliadau dod i oed – digwyddiadau a gynhaliwyd i nodi pan ddoi etifedd neu etifeddes i lawn oed, sef un ar hugain oed, ac felly gallent etifeddu ystad diriog yn swyddogol a chymryd rôl 'landlord'.

Back in October, colleagues and friends gathered at Bangor University for the launch of Dr Shaun Evans's new book, *Coming of Age Celebrations on Welsh Landed Estates: Gentry, Culture and Society, c.1770–1920*. Published by Boydell & Brewer in September 2025, this book breaks new ground as the first comprehensive study of coming of age celebrations – events which were held to mark the twenty-first birthday of an heir or heiress, when they attained their legal majority and could therefore officially inherit a landed estate and assume the role of 'landlord'.

Attendees of the launch were treated to a fascinating conversation between Dr Evans and Dr Lowri Ann Rees. As well as learning about the nature of coming of age celebrations and what they can tell us about gentry culture and landowner-tenant

Earlier this month, we were delighted to welcome Dr Marion Löffler, Reader in Welsh History and History and Head of History at Cardiff University, to Bangor to deliver ISWE's second Annual Lecture. The Annual Lecture is a chance to share recent and ongoing research on themes which are important to us as an Institute, and Dr Löffler's presentation combined two of our primary interests: women's history and the role that the Welsh gentry played in shaping the identity of Wales.

The subject of the lecture was Lady Augusta Hall (1802–1896) of Llanover House in

## ISWE pioneers new MA module on 'Reinterpreting the Country House'

In September 2025, ISWE was delighted to launch a new module called 'Reinterpreting the Country House: Archives, Interpretation and the Histories of Wales' for students on Bangor University's Global Heritage, History and Welsh History MA programmes. Co-designed by Dr Lowri Ann Rees and Dr Shaun Evans, the module provides students with an opportunity to learn from and contribute towards the work of ISWE.

The course includes dedicated sessions on a range of themes such as landscape, material culture, libraries, women's history, colonial connections and social history. Most of the sessions take place within Bangor University Archives and Special

**Collections, and there are also fieldtrips to nearby heritage sites such as Penrhyn Castle and Storiol Museum. Over the course of the module, students are encouraged to interrogate the latest research in gentry culture, landed estates and the country house, and best-practice in public engagement and heritage interpretation.**

One of the module's primary aims is to equip students with the tools to create high-quality heritage interpretation based on original research of archives, collections and landscapes. For the assessment, students are asked to design and deliver an 'interpretation intervention', based on primary research and heritage best-practice.

This excellent blog was Issy's 'interpretation intervention': it discusses the author, historian and educational promoter Lady Margaret Verney (1844–1930) of Rhianfa, who was involved in the early development of Bangor University. Thanks for sharing your excellent work with us, Issy!

The group consists of over a hundred PhD researchers from universities, historic houses and arts institutions who are studying different aspects of the British country house. For their third annual conference the Group partnered with The National Gallery in London, providing members with an opportunity to present their research in the Gallery's main lecture theatre, and to representatives from The National Trust, English Heritage, The Attingham Trust, and The Paul Mellon Centre.

Daisy's research focuses on women and the country house; her doctoral project seeks to reconstruct and rebalance country house histories to fully include women and the roles they played, their importance, and their legacy, with a regional case study straddling Cheshire and north Wales. Her paper was entitled 'The Invisible Work of Feeling: Emotional Labour and Country House Women, 1600–1800', and was presented as part of the final panel of the day, which was on the theme of '(Re)considering the Aristocracy and the Country House'. Daisy also participated in a Q&A session with her fellow presenters after the panel.

Gardens of Gwydir Castle'. Mae gardd deg erw Gwydir yn Nyffryn Conwy yn cael ei chydabod yn eang fel un o erddi pwysicaf Cymru. Nid yn unig y mae'n ardd restredig Gradd I, ond mae ganddi dros wyth deg o goed a warchodir.

Gan gwmpasu dros bedwar cant o flynyddoedd mewn pum tudalen, mae erthygl ragorol Dr Moncrieffe yn amlygu natur amlhaenog yr ardd hon. Mae'n dechrau drwy archwilio gwreiddiau'r ardd yn yr unfed ganrif ar bymtheg, gan dynnu ar ymchwil doethurol Meinir ar Syr John Wynn o Gwydir (1553–1627), y gwnaeth hi ei [gwblhau yn 2024](#). Mae'n disgrifio'r cyfuniad o diroedd pleser a gerddi cynhyrchiol a 'fframiodd y tŷ' ac a wasanaethodd fel lleoliad ar gyfer priodasau a gwleddoedd helaeth. Yn ddiweddarach yn yr erthygl, mae Meinir yn trafod gwaith y dylunwyr gerddi enwog Syr Charles Barry a Lewis Kennedy yn yr 1820au a'r 1830au, a oedd yn cynnwys creu dehongliad Fictoraidd nodedig o'r ardd bleser Tuduraidd yng Ngwydir. Gardens of Gwydir Castle'. The ten-acre garden of Gwydir in the Conwy Valley is widely recognised as one of the most important gardens in Wales. Not only is it Grade I listed, but it has over eighty protected trees.

Covering over four-hundred years in five pages, Dr Moncrieffe's excellent article illuminates the multi-layered nature of this garden. It begins by examining the garden's sixteenth-century origins, drawing on Meinir's doctoral research on Sir John Wynn of Gwydir (1553–1627), which she [completed in 2024](#). It describes the combination of pleasure grounds and productive gardens which 'framed the house' and served as the setting for weddings and feasts galore. Later in the article, Meinir discusses the work of celebrated garden designers Sir Charles Barry and Lewis Kennedy in the 1820s and 1830s, which involved creating a distinctly Victorian interpretation of the Tudor pleasure garden at Gwydir. We are always delighted to see our graduates sharing their research in such esteemed publications and being recognised as experts in their fields.

### Plas Nannau at Risk

In December, The Georgian Group unveiled their annual 'Top 10 Heritage at Risk List' for 2025, which has the strapline 'stop the rot' and which features Plas Nannau in Llanfachreth, Gwynedd. Despite its Grade II\*-listed status, the Neo-Classical mansion has been in an accelerated state of decline since 2020, when lead was stolen from the roof leading to water damage, and it is at serious risk of being lost altogether unless immediate action is taken.

In our recent [blog post](#), we explored the architectural and historical significance of the Plas and wider estate. We also spoke to Phillip Nannau Williams, descendant of the Nannau family and author of *Nannau: A Rich Tapestry of Wales*, and Thomas Lloyd, ISWE Advisory Board member and author of *The Lost Houses of Wales*, both of whom lamented the present condition of the house.

We must work to carve out an alternative future for this special place and ISWE stands ready to work with Eryri National Park Authority and the local community as part of this endeavour.

**National Lottery Heritage Funding for Plas Gunter and Gregynog**

Hoffem longyfarch Ymddiriedolaeth Plas Gunter, sydd wedi derbyn Grant Cyflawni gwerth £3.3 miliwn yn ddiweddar gan Gronfa Dreftadaeth y Loteri Genedlaethol tuag at adnewyddu [Plas Gunter](#) yn y Fenni, Sir Fynwy. Mae gan y tŷ tref o'r ail ganrif ar bymtheg arwyddocâd crefyddol arbennig gan fod teulu Gunter yn ymarfer eu crefydd fel Catholigion Rhufeinig yn ystod y Diwygiad Protestannaidd; roedd ganddynt hyd yn oed gapel cyfrinachol yn yr atig. Mae hwn yn gyfnod cyffrous, gan y bydd y grant yn galluogi'r Ymddiriedolaeth i agor Plas Gunter i'r cyhoedd am y tro cyntaf yn ei hanes 400 mlynedd!

Mae Cronfa Dreftadaeth y Loteri Genedlaethol hefyd wedi dyfarnu Grant Datblygu o ychydig o dan £900,000 i Ymddiriedolaeth Gregynog tuag at y project '[Codi'r To](#)' yn Neuadd Gregynog yn Nhregynon, Sir Drefaldwyn. Mae Gregynog yn blasty gwledig o bwys cenedlaethol, sy'n fwyaf adnabyddus fel cyn gartref y chwirydd Davies, Gwendoline a Margaret, a'i trawsnewidiodd yn ganolfan gelfyddydau yn yr 1920au. Roedd hefyd yn destun project ymchwil doethurol Dr Mary Oldham, un o fyfyrwyr doethurol y Sefydliad, a gwblhawyd yn 2024. Mae angen adnewyddu to'r Neuadd ar frys, a bydd y grant hwn yn cael ei ddefnyddio tuag at baratoi dyluniadau. Dymunwn y gorau i Ymddiriedolaeth Gregynog yn yr ymdrech hon.

We would like to extend our congratulations to the Plas Gunter Mansion Trust, who have recently been awarded a £3.3million Delivery Grant from the National Lottery Heritage Fund towards the renovation of [Plas Gunter](#) in Abergavenny, Monmouthshire. The seventeenth-century townhouse has special religious significance as the Gunter family were practicing Roman Catholics during the Protestant Reformation; they even had a secret chapel in the attic. This is an exciting time, as the grant will enable the Trust to open Plas Gunter to the public for the first time in its 400-year history!

The National Lottery Heritage Fund have also awarded a Development Grant of just under £900,000 to the Gregynog Trust, towards the '[Raise the Roof](#)' project at Gregynog Hall in Tregynon, Montgomeryshire. Gregynog is a nationally important country house, best known as the former home of the Davies sisters, Gwendoline and Margaret, who transformed it into a hub of the arts in the 1920s. It was also the subject of our very own Dr Mary Oldham's doctoral research project, completed in 2024. The roof of the Hall is in urgent need of renewal, and this grant will be put towards the preparation of designs. We wish the Gregynog Trust all the best in this endeavour.

### **New Roof for St Fagans Castle**

At the beginning of this year, Amgueddfa Cymru commenced an ambitious project to [replace the roof of St Fagans Castle](#), the Grade I-listed, Elizabethan country house at the heart of St Fagans National History Museum in Cardiff. The project, which is being funded by the Welsh Government, involves the erection of a large scaffolding on all sides of the house and is estimated to take two years to complete, though the Castle will remain open to visitors for most of this period. St Fagans Castle is of special interest to ISWE as the subject of our recent graduate Dr Bethan Scorey's doctoral research, and we will be following the project with excitement and interest.

### **Funding for Insole Court Archive Project**

In other funding news, we are pleased to hear that our friends [Insole Court](#) in Cardiff have been awarded funding for their project 'Insole Court Archive Revealed'. Over the next eighteen months, they will catalogue and digitise their archive to make it accessible both on site and online. There are also plans to organise a programme of events to engage a wider audience. The funding has been jointly awarded by the National Lottery Heritage Fund, The Pilgrim Trust, the Wolfson Foundation, and The

Pilgrim, Sefydliad Wolfson a'r Archifau Cenedlaethol. Edrychwn ymlaen at weld sut mae'r project yn datblygu.

Bydd y project, sy'n mynd rhagddo mewn cydweithrediad â'n ffrindiau yng Nghomisiwn Brenhinol Henebion Cymru (RCAHMW), yn cynhyrchu'r argraffiad a'r dadansoddiad cynhwysfawr cyntaf o'r tua 180 o siarteri Cymru sydd wedi goroesi o'r cyfnod canoloesol cynnar (tua 600–1000).

Nodwedd ryfeddol o siarteri Cymru yw eu bod yn cynnwys disgrifiadau manwl o ffiniau, a'r bwriad yw eu cymharu â mapiau ystadau a chau tiroedd diweddarach i gynhyrchu gwybodaeth newydd am ddatblygiad hanesyddol tirwedd Cymru. Rydym wrth ein bodd yn clywed y bydd y wybodaeth newydd hon ar gael am ddim mewn atlas hanesyddol ar-lein, a fydd yn cynnwys map digidol 3D. Heb os, bydd hyn yn adnodd amhrisiadwy i ni yn Sefydliad Ymchwil Ystadau Cymru.

### **Lansio Ymgyrch Ariannu Castell Gwydir**

Mae perchnogion Castell Gwydir, Peter Welford a Judy Corbett, wedi lansio [ymgyrch gyhoeddus yn ddiweddar i godi arian](#) tuag at waith atgyweirio brys i'r brif neuadd ganoloesol. ### **AHRC-funded Project 'Pushes the Boundaries of Medieval Wales'**

We are excited to report that Dr Ben Guy, Assistant Professor in Celtic at the University of Cambridge and expert on medieval Welsh language and literature, has recently been awarded funding for a new three-year project called '[Pushing the boundaries of early medieval Wales: An edition of the earliest Welsh charters](#)'. The project, which proceeds in collaboration with our friends at RCAHMW, will produce the first comprehensive edition and analysis of the approximately 180 Welsh charters which survive from the early medieval period (c.600–1000).

A remarkable feature of the Welsh charters is that they contain detailed descriptions of boundaries, and the intention is to compare these with later estate and enclosure maps to generate new knowledge about the historical development of the Welsh landscape. We are delighted to hear that this new knowledge will be made freely accessible in an online historical atlas, which will include a 3D digital map. This will no doubt be an invaluable resource for us at ISWE.

### **Gwydir Castle Launch Funding Campaign**

The owners of Gwydir Castle, Peter Welford and Judy Corbett, have recently launched a [public fundraising campaign](#) to raise money for emergency repair works to the medieval hall range. With their regular social media posts, Peter and Judy have built up a worldwide following, and they have succeeded in raising over £12,000 since February. As a result, they have been able to commence the first phase of work, which involves re-pointing using traditional lime mortar and replacing the leadwork. However, the campaign continues, as Peter and Judy are hoping to raise a total of £20,000 in order to safeguard Gwydir's future and ensure public access for generations to come.

### **Welsh Country Houses on Screen**

It has been wonderful to see several Welsh country houses and heritage attractions featured on television recently, including Treberfydd House in Llangasty Tal-y-llyn, near Brecon, which appeared in the Channel 4 series '[Saving Country Houses with Penelope Keith](#)'. In this programme, Penelope visits country houses across Britain to learn more about the innovative ways that owners are generating income, from weddings to glamping to craft fairs.

Ac fe wnaeth Chateau Rhianfa dynnu sylw at yr Arglwyddes Sarah Hay-Williams (1801-76) fel yr union reswm pam mae'r plasty gwledig hwn ar Ynys Môn yn bodoli.

Mae'n wych gweld cyfraniadau'r merched hyn yn cael sylw dyledus fel rhan o ddehongliad o safleoedd o'r fath.

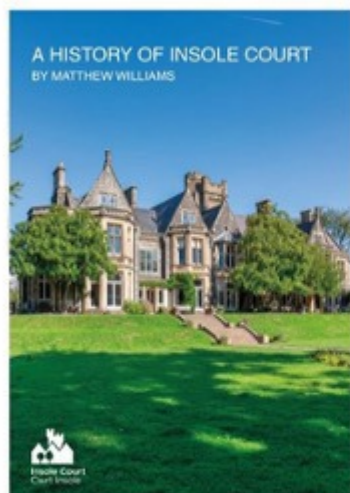
Elsewhere, both Gwrych Castle in Abergele and Hay Castle in Hay-on-Wye featured in the Sky HISTORY series '[Great British Castle Rescue](#)', which follows presenter Rick Edwards as he ventures inside some of Britain's most spectacular and endangered castles to meet the heritage experts, engineers and craftspeople racing to save these buildings.

### International Women's Day

We were delighted to see so many Welsh country houses using International Women's Day as an opportunity to promote, via social media, stories relating to the lives and experiences of important women associated with their histories.

Margam Country Park posted on the contribution of Olivia Emma Talbot (1842-94) towards the history of the estate and development of Port Talbot. Bodrhyddan Hall celebrated the life of Georgina Shipley (c.1755-1805), who studied under Sir Joshua Reynolds and exhibited paintings at the Royal Academy. And Chateau Rhianfa pointed to Lady Sarah Hay-Williams (1801-76) as the very reason why this Anglesey country house exists.

It's brilliant to see the contributions of these women being given due prominence as part of the interpretation of such sites.

### ISWE Research Seminars

Since the publication of our last newsletter, ISWE has hosted three fantastic research seminars at Bangor University, which were also made available for viewing online.

Back in November, Dr Gareth Huws delivered a fascinating presentation entitled 'Teach Mór, Plasty, Mansion: a consideration of two Irish-Welsh estates', which considered the ownership of estates across Ireland and Wales in the eighteenth and nineteenth century. Dr Huws used hitherto under-explored source material at Bangor University Archives to address questions such as did the owners treat their Welsh and Irish tenants in the same way? And were such estates considered to be particularly Irish or particularly Welsh?

In December, we welcomed Peter Sandford to Bangor from the University of the Islands and Highlands in Scotland. Peter's doctoral research, which is co-supervised by Dr Lowri Ann Rees, focuses on the anti-tithe campaigns of the latter half of the nineteenth century, and his presentation was titled 'The Tithe War in North and South-West Wales 1886–1895'.

### **Powis Castle Research Presented to the Cymmrodorion Society**

In February, ISWE's Honorary Research Associate, Dr Melvin Humphreys, delivered the June Gruffydd Memorial Lecture for The Honourable Society of Cymmrodorion, in association with the Montgomery Society, at The Medical Society in London. Dr Humphreys is currently compiling a history of the Powis estates, and this research formed the basis of his lecture titled 'Powis Castle: Exploring Myths from the 18th Century'. ### **‘The Great Welsh Land Case’ Explored in National Library of Wales Lecture**

In March, Murray Ll. Chapman was invited to the National Library of Wales to deliver a lecture on 'The Great Welsh Land Case'. Initiated by Sir Edward Herbert shortly after he acquired the Barony of Powis in 1587, this was a significant case that established his rights over the common and waste lands located within each of the townships in the barony. The case judgement also set a precedent that was to be used throughout the Welsh circuits. Murray's talk delved into the background of the case, the principal figures involved, and its lasting impact on Welsh legal history.

### **Short Course Explores the Historic Landmarks of North Wales**

February and March saw the delivery of a free, four-week short course exploring the historic landmarks of Wales at Bangor University. In the first session, Dr Euryrn Roberts discussed the medieval Welsh llys (princely court) as a centre of power, governance, culture, and daily life in medieval Wales. The second session was delivered by ISWE's Director Dr Shaun Evans on the theme 'Estates, Monuments and the Making of the Welsh Landscape', which considered how the gentry fashioned the landscapes and townscapes of Wales, through

### **Past and Future of Eryri Explored in Archives Annual Lecture**

We are ever so proud of our doctoral researcher Alex Ioannou, who was invited to give the Bangor University Archives and Special Collections Annual Lecture in November.

The title of Alex's lecture was 'Challenging time(s): Exploring how we shape the past and future of Eryri through the exchange of material culture'. It provided a fascinating insight into his interdisciplinary doctoral research project, which seeks to connect current discussions about landscape change with the past, through a combination of historical research in the archives and engagement and knowledge-exchange activities in the present, all in his case study area of Dyffryn Ogwen.

Since joining us at ISWE, Alex has fully immersed himself in the Archives, including as Research and Digitisation Assistant on the Welsh-government funded project to digitise the Jamaica Papers within the Penrhyn Estate collection. Through his research, collaboration, creativity and care he has shone a light on how archival material can contribute meaningfully to some of the major challenges and issues of the present day.

### **ISWE Out and About**

Public and community engagement is really important to our identity as a research centre and we encourage our doctoral cohort to share their research far and wide.

In October, Anna Reynolds accompanied Dr Mari Wiliam to Menai Bridge, where they gave a talk to the Gwynedd branch of the Welsh Historic Gardens Trust about an ongoing oral history project to capture memories of gardeners past and present at Bodnant Gardens. Also in October, Jeff Childs spoke to the South West Wales Industrial Archaeology Society about the gentry families of the Lordship of the Gower, the subject of his doctoral research. Jeff is also scheduled to give a talk to Baglan Men's Society and another as part of Swansea Central Library's Local Studies series.

At the beginning of this year, Ieuan Wyn Jones delivered a lecture on Thomas Edward Ellis MP, the subject of his doctoral research, to a packed Canolfan y Plase in Bala. In March Vic Tyler-Jones entertained the Friends of Wrexham Museum with a talk about his doctoral research

on the nineteenth-century squatter settlement on Newtown Mountain, and will be talking to the Broughton History Society this month.

### Bangor History Festival

Back in October, Bangor University collaborated with Bangor City Council, Storiol Museum and Bangor Cathedral to launch the two-day Bangor History Festival. The Saturday saw a full day of workshops, discussions, interactive exhibitions and guest talks across four locations. The headline talks on Saturday and Sunday were delivered by two of Britain's leading historians, authors and broadcasters – Greg Jenner and Professor Kate Williams.

ISWE was represented at the Festival by Dr Shaun Evans, who gave a talk titled 'When did the gentry lose their Welsh?', which explored the relationship between the landed gentry and the Welsh language. Notwithstanding an undeniable long-term trajectory of Welsh-language decline, Shaun found that several landowners retained Welsh-language abilities and affinities well into the nineteenth century.
