DESCRIPTION:

A pretty, little North Wales village at the foot of Snowdon (the highest mountain in Wales and England), in the heart of Snowdonia National Park. Llanberis has several tourist attractions, local walks and shops where you can buy gifts and souvenirs. Highlights include: The National Slate Museum, Electric Mountain, Llanberis Lake Railway, Snowdon Mountain Railway, <u>Dolbadarn Castle</u> and a walk around the lake in Padarn Country Park.

Llanberis is home to people who love rock-climbing and other outdoor activities, so there are also several outdoor clothing and equipment shops.

Bus from Bangor - Caernarfon - Llanberis: 88 Bus timetable
