- 1) Fee Status: Fee status is assessed in accordance with the Education (Fees and Awards) Regulations 1983 (as amended). Additional guidance on Home/Overseas fee status is available from the UK Council for International Student Affairs (UKCISA).
- 2) With the exception of students from the Republic of Ireland, covered under the Common Travel Area arrangement, fees for students from the European Union can be found under 2022/23 Tuition Fees (International), along with information about scholarships and other financial support.
- **3)** These are fees for students starting a programme during the 2022/23 academic year. Fees for continuing students can be found by referring to the schedule that corresponds to the year of the commencement of studies, here.
- 4) Please note that additional bench fee/laboratory charges may be raised on certain postgraduate programmes. Students will be informed of this when offered a place at the University.
- **5) Part-time Fees:** Unless listed separately, part-time fees for programmes are charged as an approximate proportion of the full-time fee.
- 6) Tuition Fees for Staff: All Bangor University employees (with the exception of those who are currently, or about to be, registered as a full-time student) are eligible to be considered for a fee waiver on University programmes. (See Tuition Fees Policy)
