Tuition Fees for Staff (Terms & Conditions)

- The member of staff should have a formal contract of employment (liable for class 1A NI contributions unless exempted from NI due to age) with the University valid from the date of registration until the end of the 'current' fee charging period (e.g. academic year).
- Where a member of staff is employed as a Research Assistant and the registration on a research degree is a condition of the employment contract, tuition fees are eligible for consideration for a fee waiver.
- The contracted working hours should be greater than 12 hours per week.
- Where the contract of employment terminates part way through a subsequent fee charging period (e.g. next academic year), fees will be charged on a pro-rata basis from the end of the contract.
- Fee waivers are not available where a member of staff is eligible to claim the equivalent of the tuition fee through a Local Education Authority grant
- Where fees have been charged on a pro-rata basis from the end of a contract, the fees will be recalculated or reimbursed as appropriate if a contract is extended or a new contract is issued.
- Any additional charges (e.g. bench fees, study visits, dissertation submission, examination, etc) will still be payable.
- Where a student ceases to qualify for a fee waiver part way through a course and more than 50% of the tuition fee has been covered by the waiver, then the examination fee will be due.
- In the case of all students the granting of a fee waiver will be subject to the agreement of the academic school concerned.

Charging and refund policy (Terms & Conditions)

- All registered students who withdraw within three weeks of the commencement of their course (for part-time students the 'commencement' of the course is defined as the date of registration) within any academic session will be charged the minimum 'handling fee' as stipulated in the current tuition fee schedule of the University, or the actual tuition fee (minimum 1 week) whichever is the lesser.
- Scholarships awarded for the year in which a student withdraws are subject to additional conditions and may be cancelled. If you are in receipt of a scholarship, please check its terms and conditions as specified in your offer or other communication from the University.
- **No refunds will be made to students withdrawing in the last 4 weeks of an academic session**
- **Full time undergraduate students** withdrawing (after 3 weeks) in the first term will be charged on a weekly basis pro-rata up to a maximum of 25% of the annual fee, those withdrawing in the second term will be charged on a weekly basis pro-rata up to a maximum of 50% of the annual fee. Students withdrawing in the third term will be charged on a weekly basis pro-rata up to a maximum of the full annual fee. *[N.B. Welsh and EU students will have their fee liability reduced proportionally to reflect the fee grant element].*
- Full time postgraduates withdrawing (after 3 weeks) will be charged pro-rata based on the number of weeks of study followed based on course duration
- Part time students withdrawing (after 3 weeks) will be charged pro-rata based on credits registered for.
