What is a PLSP?

Personal Learning Support Plans (PLSPs) contain the reasonable adjustments the University is required to make under the Equality Act 2010.

- Following the Reasonable Adjustments included in a PLSP ensures you meet your individual legal obligations under the Equality Act 2021.
- The PLSP system is bespoke to Bangor and brings together all the reasonable adjustments in one easy to access online service.

Essentials for getting a PLSP

In order to have a PLSP put in place the student **must**:

Register with Disability Services (this includes giving the relevant consent to share)

Provide documentary evidence (NB: students who register but haven't provided evidence are given guidance on how to obtain evidence.)

Need-to-know basis

Information is shared on a need-to-know basis depending on the staff member's role with that student, e.g. a Personal Tutor will see the whole PLSP, but a MO sees only the T&L and Assessment sections; Halls staff see only information relevant to them.

How do Disability Services ensure the students do what is needed to have a PLSP?

Students who have contacted Disability Services or have been referred to us will be prompted to register and provide evidence. Reminders are sent where necessary.

- Applicants who declare a disability code on their UCAS form are encouraged to register so that their PLSP can be in place before the start of the course.
- Individuals who might be eligible for the Disabled Students Allowance (DSA) are encouraged to apply for it (see our DSA flow chart for details)
