

Financial BANGOR UNIVERSITY Support for Students in 2017/18

Tuition Fees

Bangor University will charge full time UK and EU undergraduate students a tuition fee of up to £9,000 per academic year.

Tuition Fee Loan – students can choose to take out a loan to cover their tuition fees.

Welsh domiciled and EU (non-UK) students could be eligible for **Tuition Fee Loan** and a non-repayable **Tuition Fee Grant** from the Welsh Government

Funding for English domiciled Students

English domiciled full time undergraduate students can apply for a **Maintenance Loan** of up to £8,430. How much you get will depend on your taxable household income:

Household income below £25,000 = £8,430 Household income over £62,180 = £3,928

Funding for Welsh domiciled Student

Welsh domiciled full time undergraduate students can apply for a **Welsh Government Learning Grant** up to £5,161. How much you get will depend on your taxable household income.

Income £18,370 or below = £5,161
Income between £18,371-£50,020=partial grant
Maintenance Loan

Loans are available to help students with their living costs.

Students living away from home could receive up to £6,922. Whilst student living at home with their parents could receive up to £5,358

Loans and Grants are only available to UK students studying their first full time undergraduate degree.

Student must also be under 60 at the start of the course to receive a maintenance loan.

Additional Financial Support

<u>Parent Learning Allowance</u> - How much you receive will depend on household income.

<u>Childcare Grant</u> – eligible full time students with dependant children in registered /approved childcare can apply for help with childcare costs.

<u>Disabled Student Allowance</u> – to help disabled students with extra costs they may have whilst undertaking a degree course as a direct result of their disability or specific leaning difficulty.

This allowance does not depend on household income.

University Bursaries

Bangor Bursary – dependant on household income. Household income £25,000 or below = £1,000 and £500 if the household income is between £25,000 - £40,000

Welsh Medium Study Bursaries - £250 if a student studies 40 credits or more through the medium of welsh.

Start- up Bursaries - £1,000 available to Care Leavers, and former foyer residents in their first year only.

Carers Bursary –£1,000 available to students who provide unpaid caring support and who will continue to carer whilst they study.

Relocation Bursary – Student who relocate to Bangor with their families could apply for £1,000 bursary if their taxable income is below £25,000. Available in the first year only

Homeless Bursary – If you were homeless pre entry you could apply for £500 bursary to help with your initial costs. Available in yr 1 only.

How and when to apply for funding Do not wait until you have a confirmed place before applying for funding.
