

Financial Support for Students in 2019/20

Tuition Fees

Bangor University will charge full time UK and EU undergraduate students a tuition fee of up to **£9,000** per academic year.

Students can choose to take out a **Tuition Fee Loan** to cover their tuition fees.

The loan is repaid when you earn £25,000 or more.

Funding for English Students

English domiciled full time undergraduate students can apply for a **Maintenance Loan** of up to **£8,944.** How much you get will depend on your taxable household income:

Household income below £25,000 = £8,944 Household income over £62,180 = £4,164

Funding for Welsh Student

Welsh domiciled full time undergraduate students can apply for a **Welsh Government Learning Grant** up to **£8,100**. How much you get will depend on your taxable household income.

Income £18,370 or below = £8,100 Income between £18,371-£59,199=partial grant Income over £59,200 = £1,000

<u>Maintenance Loan</u> - are available to help students with their living costs. Students living away from home could receive up to £8,225. Whilst student living at home with their parents could receive up to £6,840

Loans and Grants are only available to UK students studying their first full time undergraduate degree.

Student must also be under 60 at the start of the course to receive a maintenance loan.

Additional Financial Support

Parent Learning Allowance - How much you receive will depend on household income. **Childcare Grant** – eligible full time students with dependant children in registered /approved childcare can apply for help with childcare costs.

Disabled Student Allowance – to help disabled students with extra costs they may have whilst undertaking a degree course as a direct result of their disability or specific leaning difficulty.

This allowance does not depend on household income.

University Bursaries

Bangor Bursary – dependant on household income and available to EU & UK students (excluding Welsh students). Household income $\pounds 25,000$ or below = $\pounds 1,000$ and $\pounds 500$ if the household income is between $\pounds 25,000$ - $\pounds 40,000$

Welsh Medium Study Bursaries - £250 if a student studies 40 credits or more through the medium of welsh.

Start- up Bursaries – **£1,000** available to Care Leavers, and former foyer residents in their first year only.

Carers Bursary –**£1,000** available to students who provide unpaid caring support and who will continue to carer whilst they study.

Relocation Bursary – Student who relocate to Bangor with their families could apply for $\pounds 1,000$ bursary if their taxable income is below $\pounds 25,000$. Available in the first year only

Homeless Bursary – If you were homeless pre entry, you could apply for **£500** bursary to help with your initial costs. Available in first year only.

How and when to apply for funding Do not wait until you have a confirmed place before applying for funding.
