Engaging our students and staff with sustainability and the well-being of current and future generations

While Bangor University is directly responsible for many of the impacts of its operations, it relies on its community of students and staff to contribute significantly to modifying its overall impacts through personal and group actions. The University actively encourages its students and staff to make long lasting and far-reaching sustainable behaviour changes to not only enable it to make continual sustainable improvements to institutional operations and practices, but also to enable those students and staff to take their new behaviours into all areas of their lives both within and outside the University.

Our staff and students

Our students are central to everything we do here at Bangor. We know that they are passionate about sustainability. NUS surveys¹ for many years have revealed that:

89% say they agree their place of study should **"actively incorporate and promote sustainable development"**

81% would like to see "sustainable development actively incorporated and promoted through all courses"

65% say "sustainable development is something they would like to learn more about"

Both **Bangor University** and **Undeb Bangor** (the Students' Union) have sustainability as a strategic enabler, and our students can take direct sustainable action according to the <u>Undeb Bangor</u> <u>Sustainability Statement</u> as well as with staff through the University's strategic plan: <u>Strategy 2030 -</u> <u>A Sustainable World for Future Generations</u>, and our <u>Strategy 2030: Sustainability Strategy</u>.

Sustainability is embedded throughout our strategic planning which emphasises its importance as a central organising principle of the University's mission, vision, and values. By acting in accordance with our strategic plan, staff are empowered and enabled to embed sustainable behaviour change throughout the University, both amongst colleagues and with our students.

Student and staff involvement in sustainability governance, management, development, and delivery

Students are represented on the majority of University committees dealing with the policies and strategic decisions of the University. Oversight of the development and ongoing monitoring of our various sustainability policies, strategies management and action plans by students and staff is especially enabled through their membership of the <u>Sustainability Delivery Group</u> (SDG). Students and staff are strongly encouraged to co-develop policies, strategies, action plans, projects, funding

proposals and cost analysis alongside the University and bring forward ideas for development and monitoring to the SDG.

The University will also strive to create and embed a network of sustainability champions to promote sustainability across colleges and professional services and will work with the Students' Union to further champion sustainability for the student community.

Raising awareness and encouraging involvement

Inductions

To ensure that all students and staff are aware of the opportunities for getting involved in developing and monitoring the policies, strategies and action plans that support Sustainability at Bangor, the University sustainability policy and plan, sustainability issues and student engagement opportunities for sustainability, are all a component of the induction processes for all new students and staff on the compulsory student and staff inductions. In addition, regular information is obtained through the staff and student Bulletin newsletters.

University-wide and community events and campaigns

Last year the University and Undeb Bangor ran several sustainability events and campaigns designed to reach all students and staff, and in some cases outreach into Bangor city's community.

The sustainability targets are included in the list of KPIs in the <u>Sustainability Strategy</u> and are reviewed on an annual basis to ensure best practice and continual improvement.

All staff and student engagement news and events will be published on the website, in Staff and Student Bulletins, with funded projects also reported to SDG annually until their completion.
